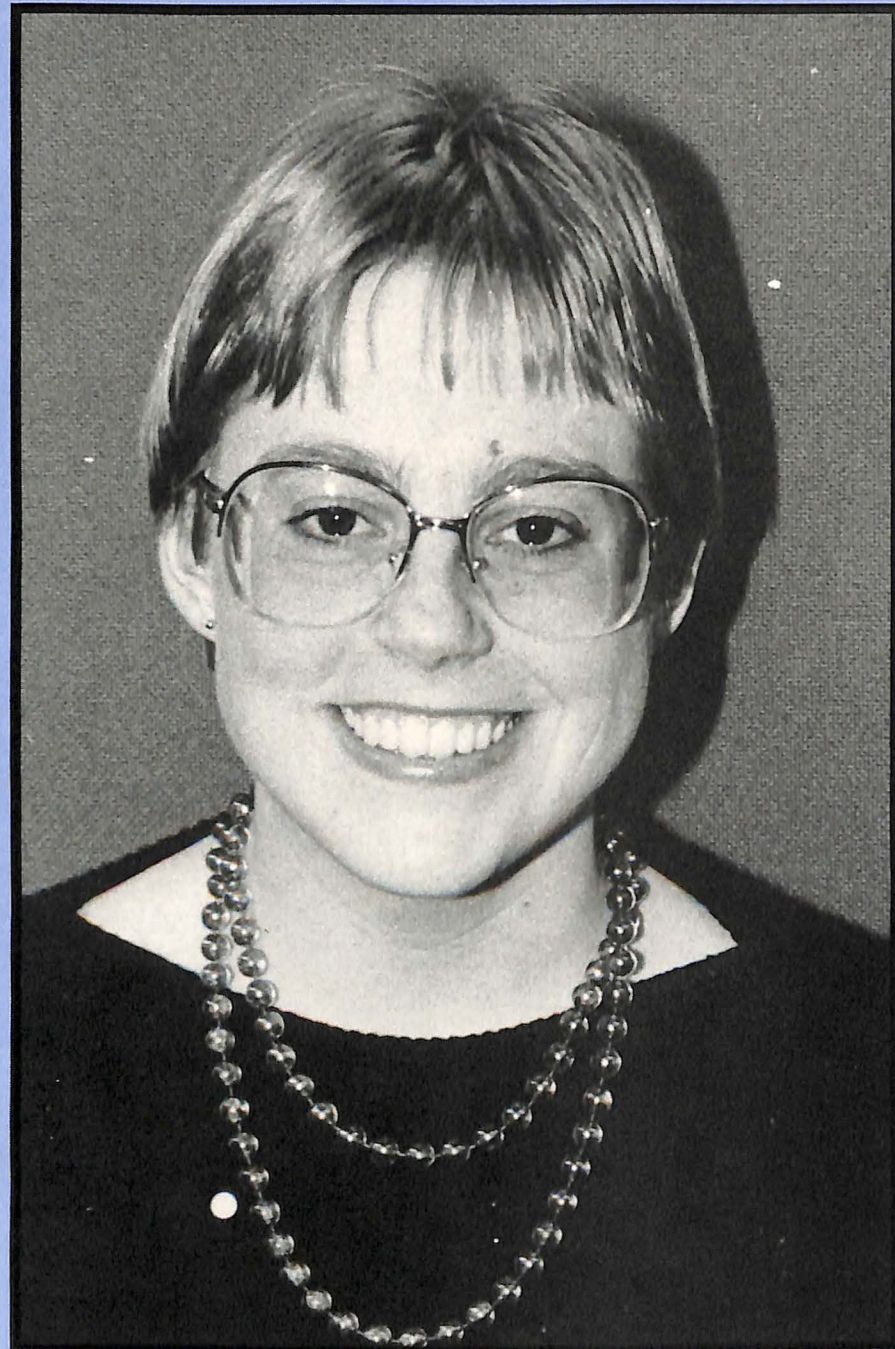

As the student population at the Mount proves, learning is not limited to age. Our learning did not stop the day we crossed the platform. It only began.

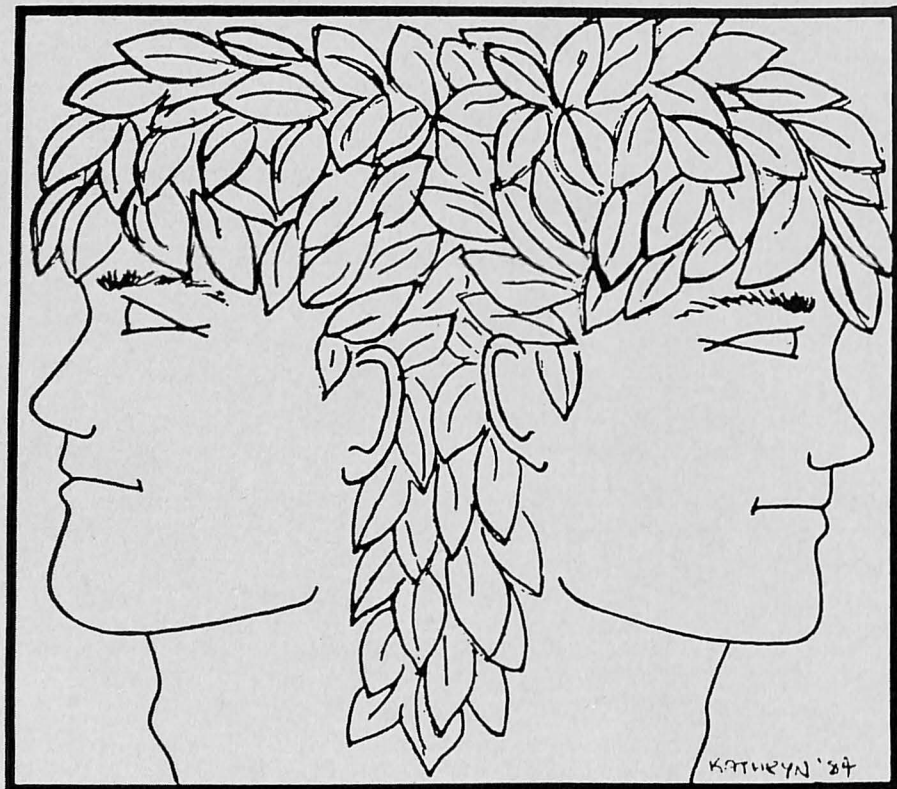
I hope that as you grow as a person, like the Mount with strength and character, you will continue to discover yourself as well as grow to understand the Mount and what it stands for.

Janus was the Roman God of beginnings, openings, entrances, doorways; of public gates through which roads passed and of private doors. Being the God of Gates, he was naturally the God of departures, returns, and by extension, the God of all means of communication.

As a yearbook then, Janus represents a departure from the university, as we achieve our goal of graduation, and also a means of returning to it, through memories captured in the words and photos found here. We look to the Janus insignia as a symbol of our progression to the future, and the many thresholds we have yet to cross, and as a symbol of those doors through which we have already passed gaining confidence, wisdom, and pride.



COAT OF ARMS

The University motto "Veritas ad deum ducit" translates to "truth leads to God", asserting the religious concerns of the University.

Based on the coat of arms of Venerable Elizabeth Seton, foundress of the Congregation of the Sisters of Charity. The University seal bears three crescents within a "tressure". The same "tressure" is found on the coat of arms granted to Nova Scotia in 1925. The book, a symbol of learning, stands between two maple leaves, an emblem of Canada. Above the book stands a dove, symbolizing the Holy Spirit, indicating that knowledge is only a means of wisdom, the highest gift of God.

The colours of the shield are blue and gold symbolizing the divinity of our Lord and blue is for our Blessed Lady.

UNIVERSITY LOGO

In January 1971, the Board of Governors approved the design of a new symbol for Mount Saint Vincent University.

The symbol, created by Eagles and Radcliffe Ltd., skillfully combined the letters 'M', 'V' and 'U' to provide a distinctive pattern that is visually appealing and easily remembered. The two circles above the pattern immediately adds warmth and creates awareness that the symbol portrays people. This, it was felt, was the essence of a university; young, alert people who are working together towards common objectives.



THE MOUNT IN RETROSPECT

Mount Saint Vincent University was established in 1873 by the Sisters of Charity. Originally, its genesis was to provide elementary and secondary education to girls, but in 1941 it became a post-secondary institution. In acknowledging a need to contribute to the higher education of women, the Mount signed a 25 year agreement with Dalhousie University. This agreement enabled the Mount to offer the first two years of bachelor programs, and Dalhousie would provide the final two years and the degree. In 1925, Mount Saint Vincent was awarded the right to grant its own degrees in music, the arts and science.

In January of 1951, the hard work and dedication of the Sisters of Charity was destroyed by fire. The Motherhouse and college were completely gutted by the blaze. In September of the same year Evaristus Hall was completed and ready to receive students once again.

Since that time, the Mount's campus has continued to grow. In order to accommodate increasing enrollment, both Assissi Hall and Rosaria Hall were added in 1966. The college, due to the expansion and approved revision of the College Charter was then endowed with the title of University.

In 1971, the Mount began to accept undergraduate men contrary to their priority of post-secondary education for women. This resulted from a five year agreement between the Mount and Dalhousie dealing with the association of equals.

The Birches were built in 1972 and Rosaria Centre was opened on March 14, 1981.

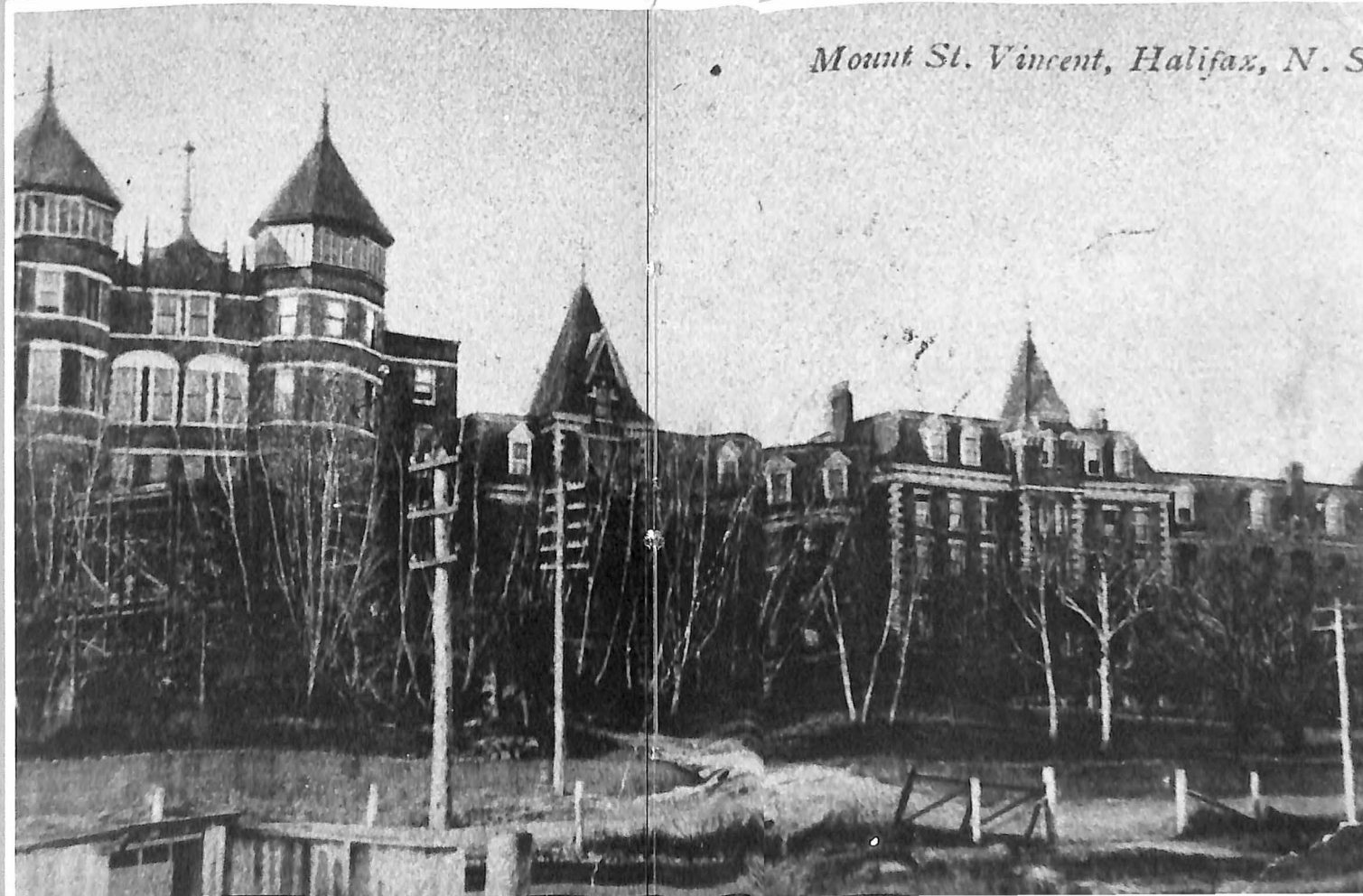
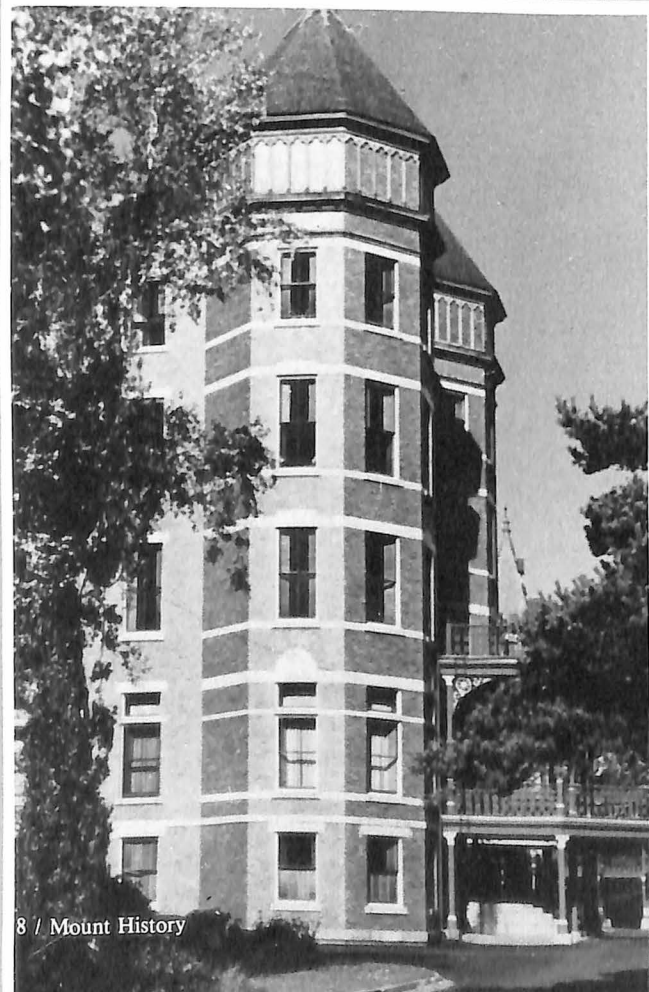

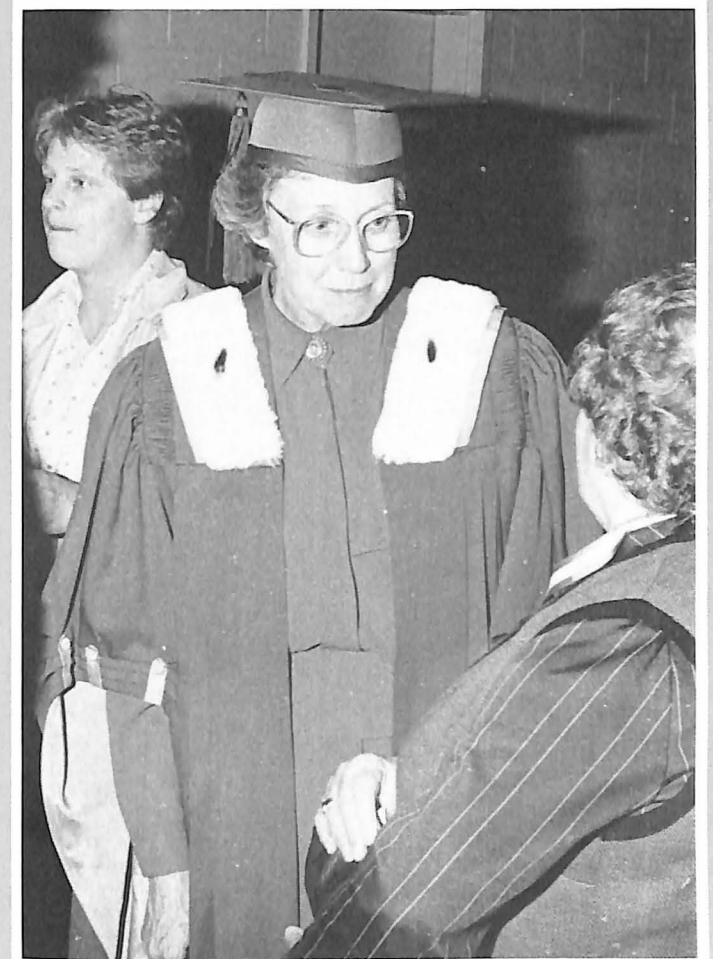


THE MOUNT INSTALLS ITS NEW PRESIDENT



1986 marked the year of the installation of Dr. Naomi Hersom as the seventh president of Mount St. Vincent University. At the October Convocation she spoke to 90 graduates emphasizing the role of the Mount as the only Canadian University primarily committed to the higher education of women.

"This distinctive role for Mount St. Vincent stems from its early history", she said. "We must take particular care now not to drift from it. Our original purpose must continue to shape the course for the future of this university."



The ceremonies were decorated with many distinguished guests, the Most Reverend James M. Hayes, Archbishop of Halifax, presiding.

Dr. Hersom received greetings from representatives of 41 Canadian universities, and salutations from Mount St. Vincent's staff, alumnae, students and faculty.

Dr. Hersom not only reviewed the accomplishments of the Mount, but paid homage to the Sisters of Charity, who she described as women of "great vision and great determination."

The Mount's badminton teams experienced a successful season. The mixed doubles team won the provincial title. And the ladies' doubles team won the Nova Scotia College Conference.

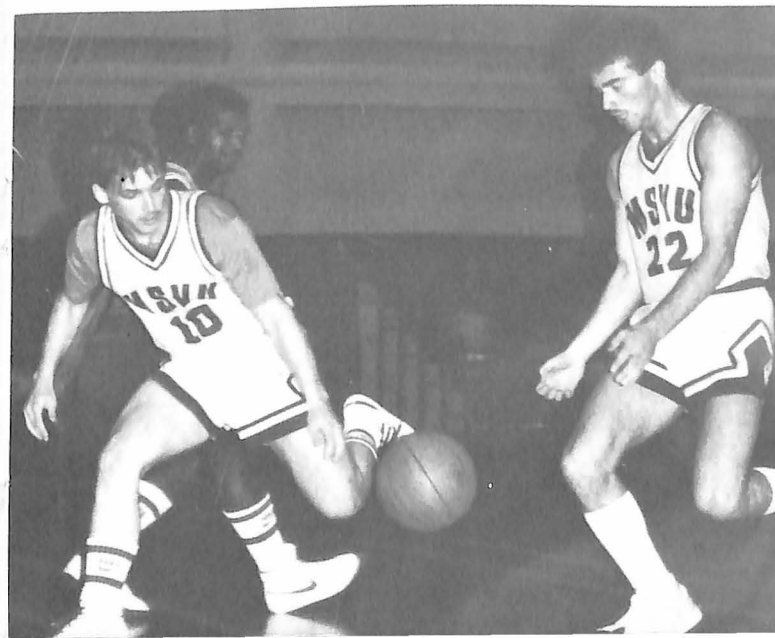
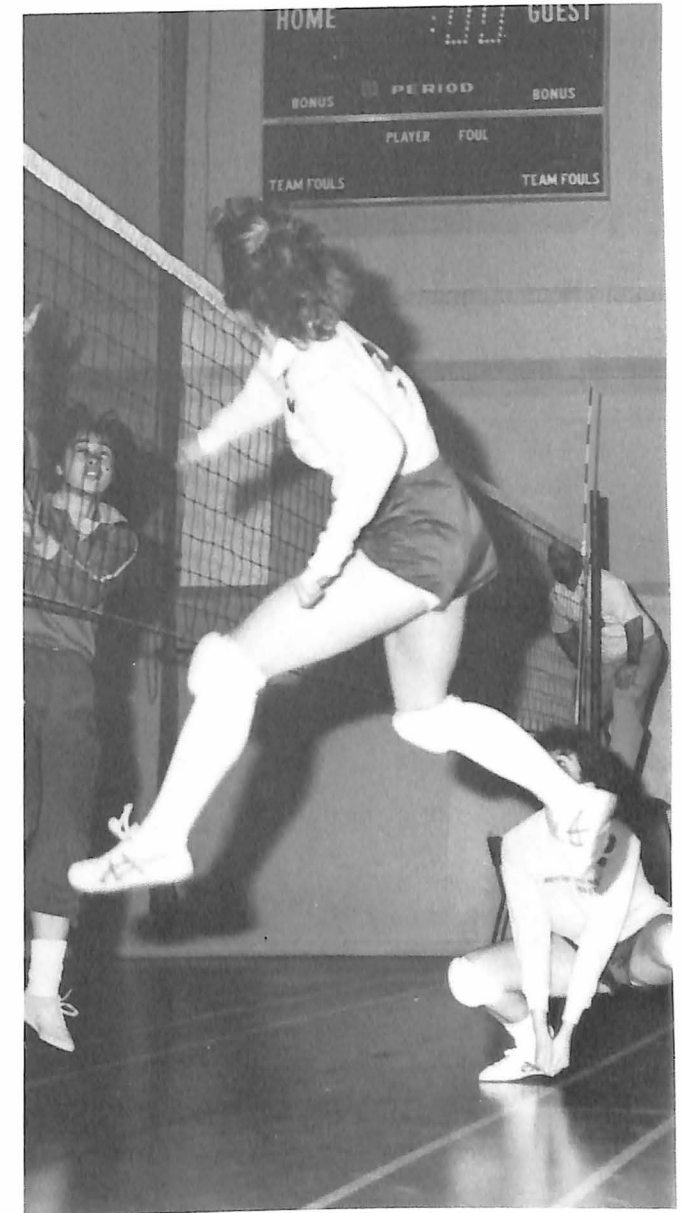
