After losing their banner the prior season to STU in the finals and then losing former coach and mentor Dyrick McDermott, it seemed like an uphill battle to even want to compete again. However, the 7 returning players from the prior year seemed more determined than ever to redeem themselves and return to their championship form for so many reasons. First year Head Coach Mark Forward and assistant coaches Elaine Horne and Dianna Keddy took over the reins for the team. Fifth year players Kaili Vanvulpen, Katherine Brien, Lyndsay MacKinnon and Amy Peveril provided the team leadership and the determination to raise another banner for the team. After going undefeated in the regular season at 21-0, the team went into the playoffs very focused and ended up redeeming themselves for last season's loss and were ACAA conference champs once again.

After the ACAA championships the team traveled to Kelowna, BC to compete for the CCAA National Championship. After an opening round win against the Alberta Champs, SAIT they then moved on to beat the Quebec conference champs, Dawson Blues, in the semi finals. These two wins allowed them to play for national gold against the two time defending champions, Ste Foy. The Women fought hard and played their best and in the end came up short in the game but won the hearts of many. ACAA champs, CCAA silver medalists, and winners of the CCAA Fair Play Award allowed the team an opportunity to heal from the season past and move forward with the life lessons and knowledge of their own personal strength, commitment and teamwork.

The Men finished the season with a 20-1 record and their 5th consecutive ACAA Conference Championship title! A first in the ACAA. The only loss this season was to Holland College who they went on to defeat in the conference championship. The men then travelled to Calgary to compete in the CCAA National Championship hosted by SAIT. During the tournament the men struggled to find their game and ended up placing 5th overall with a 1-2 record.

Carl Wickstrom, Stephen Morris and Adam Jewkes provided the senior leadership throughout the season and leave the program as champions. In the 5 years these men have been playing for the Mystics, the team has compiled a record of 108 wins and only 5 losses! All three received ACAA all conference awards along with Coach Rick Plato who received his 11th ACAA Coach of the Year award.

For the first time in 15 years, the Mount Mystics took home the ACAA Volleyball Championship title!

The team slowly improved as the season progressed and with three weeks before the ACAA Championships, turned a significant corner pushing their team play and mental preparation to a new competitive level which was evident at the ACAA Championships. The Mount Mystics Volleyball team came into the ACAA Championships hosted by UNBSJ, ranked 3rd in league play.

In semi final play, the Mount Mystics convincingly defeated Mount Allison University 27-25, 25-15, 25-16. Captain Jamie Brown was named Player of the Game for the Mount. On Sunday, the Mount Mystics faced the number one ranked team, UNBSJ in a packed gym where the team kept their focus and defeated the UNBSJ Seawolves 25-13, 19-25, 25-16, 25-19. Courtney MacPherson was named Player of the Game for the Mount. The Mystics played as Champions throughout the weekend, making the win a total team effort. Captain Jamie Brown was named to the 2009-2010 ACAA 1st All Conference Team and Co -Captain Carla Smith was named to the ACAA 2nd All Conference Team.

Under the leadership of Head Coach Derrick Brooks and Assistant Coach Dayna Hill, the team traveled to Hull, Quebec to compete at the CCAA National Volleyball Championships. The team was defeated in all three matches. Although not winning any matches, the team played extremely well and gave their opponents good competition. Andrea Melanson, Jamie Brown and Courtney MacPherson were all named Player of the Match for the Mount at the CCAA Nationals.

Caroline Smith and Amanda Forrest were our seniors this year and we recognize their contribution to the Mount Volleyball program. Congratulations to the team on a great season.



Dyrick McDermott, coach of the Mount Mystics Women's Basketball team, passed away in April of 2009.

Dyrick started at the Mount in 1989 as a player for the Men's Basketball Team. He was a successful student athlete and helped the Mount Mystics win the 1991 CCAA Men's Basketball Bronze Medal.

In 2001 Dyrick returned to the Mount as Head Coach for the Women's Basketball Team. From 2001 to 2009, Coach McDermott earned a win-loss record of 160-17 and led his team to the 2008 CCAA Silver Women's Basketball medal.

The Mount Saint Vincent University 2009-2010 Women's and Men's basketball teams dedicated their season to Dyrick's memory. The teams wore a black ribbon on their uniforms to symbolize Dyrick's integrity and commitment to family and hard work.

Coach McDermott's commitment to excellence, integrity and family will continue to be remembered and celebrated. In memory of Dyrick, the Mount has established the Dyrick McDermott Invitational Basketball Tournament and the Dyrick McDermott Leadership Award.
