It was another successful season for The Mount varsity athletics program. The Men's basketball team was once again victorious, collecting their 4th consecutive ACAA title and 11th overall. The team was recognized as the #1 ranked team in the CCAA for the entire season, a first for any Atlantic College team, and represented our conference at this years CCAA championships in Prince George, BC. Three of our teams were led by 1st year head coaches. Derrick Brooks took over the Women's Volleyball program and has led them to the ACAA semi finals, Amit Batra is now at the helm of the Women's soccer program, and is working hard to continue the winning tradition of the women's soccer program and Luke Corey has accepted the challenge of leading our Men's soccer program back to championships form. Our Athletes have continued to dominate the individual awards, winning 3 All Canadian, 3 Academic All Canadians, 1 ACAA MVP, 1 ACAA Rookie of the Year, 1 ACAA Coach of the Year, and 18 All Conference Awards.

All Conference winners included Sarah Parker, Sarah Edsall, Deidre Gormley, Sarah Ali, Amanda Doyle and Cassadra O'Neil (Women's Soccer), Matt Szeto, Patrick Johnston, Mark Harnish (Men's Soccer), Jasna Toprek, Jamie Brown, Courtney MacPherson (Women's Volleyball), Katherine Brien, Kaili Van Vulpen (Women's Basketball) and Jason Carlson, Ibrahaim Toulany, Adam Jewkes, Steve Morris (Men's Basketball). Mark Harnish (Men's Soccer) was awarded the prestigious Bob Coe Award, presented to a player in the ACAA that best combine the qualities of leadership, sportsmanship, enthusiasm and ability both on and off the field.

All Canadians were awarded to Katherine Brien (Women's Basketball). Sarah Parker (Women's Soccer) and Jason Carlson (Men's Basketball). ACAA Rookie of the Year honours went to Women's Soccer star Chrissy Henneberry. Sarah Edsall, Patrick Johnston and Matt Szeto won Academic All Canadian honours, which is presented to a varsity athlete who is an all conference player with an academic average of 3.70 or higher. Sarah Parker (Women's Soccer) was named ACAA MVP and led the CCAA in scoring this season. Head Coach, Rick Plato received ACAA Coach of the Year for the 10th time and Jason Carlson was recognized as the ACAA most valuable player in Men's Basketball as well as CCAA Player of the Year. This is the first time an ACAA Men's Basketball player has received this award.
