
The world's needs particularly pointed out in Mary's Year programme are, alas, not confined to this year. You will find them wherever your future may guide you.







FRANCES Mc'CLUSKEY "That Grand Fall's Sunshine."



To Joan Foster, Betty O'Brien relinquishes her notorious swearbox.


Our Math Whizz Dana Duggan endows on Marian Penney her ingenuity for solving intricate algebra.
