


#### A Backward Glance

Mount Saint Vincent Academy was established by the Sisters of Charity in 1873 as both an elementary and secondary school. By 1914 Halifax had grown substantially and along with it came the demand for more post-secondary institutions. As a result, the Mount entered into a 25-year agreement with Dalhousie University whereby the Mount offered the first two years of a bachelor degree and Dalhousie offered the final two years. The degree was then granted by Dalhousie.


The Nova Scotia legislature awarded Mount Saint Vincent with a college charter in May, 1925. M.S.V.C. was then able to grant its own degrees in the arts, science, and music.



On January 31, 1951 the entire College complex including the Motherhouse was destroyed by fire. In keeping with its resilient nature the Mount was still able to accept its traditional influx of September students that same year. The new building, Evaristus Hall, was the beginning of the growth that followed.



In 1966 the college charter underwent a revision which renamed the College Mount Saint Vincent University. Also, in that year Assisi Hall and Rosaria Hall were added. Seton Academic Centre was opened in 1971, boasting classrooms, offices, an Art Gallery, and a 1000-seat theatre in the round. A new five-year agreement between Dalhousie and the Mount, on an association-as-equals basis was signed admitting undergraduate men for the first time.

The Birches, five townhouse residences, were built in 1972, and Rosaria Centre was officially opened on March 14.

University education, to be meaningful, should inspire you to challenge conventional wisdom. To live fully and freely, life demands risk, adventure, vision.


Most educational institutions tend to imbue their graduates with a traditional view of adventure coming from outdated myths which entrench a conquering mentality. The centuries ahead require nontraditional leaders who are committed not to conquering but to nurturing.

The essence of the Mount experience should be that of awareness awareness that our planetary society hurtles, unless checked, toward disaster. We face environmental destruction, genetic manipulation, and indeed global extinction. Many persons respond to these problems by despair and a variety of forms of escapism; others, accept the challenge of working for positive change. 1985 is a year of celebration for our University. It is also the end of the United Nations Decade for Women - a decade that has given women, the world over, a new image of strength and courage. #### Coat of Arms

The Coat of Arms of the University is based on the Coat of Arms of Venerable Elizabeth Seton, foundress of the Congregation of the Sisters of Charity. It bears three silver crescents within the "treasure." The same "treasure" is found on the Coat of Arms granted to Nova Scotia in 1625, so the Community Foundress and the Province are represented. The three peaks on the shield signify the name of the University, "Mount" Saint Vincent. The book, a symbol of learning, is positioned between two maple leaves - the emblem of Canada. Above the book is a dove, symbolizing the Holy Spirit, and indicating that knowledge is only a means to Wisdom, the highest gift of God.

The colors of the shield are blue and gold. Gold symbolizes the divinity of our Lord and blue is for our Blessed Lady. The periphery of the Coat of Arms is royal blue and azure, the dual blues of Mount Saint Vincent University.

#### Yearbook


Just as Mount Saint Vincent University has grown and changed so has the appearance, content, and name of the yearbooks produced to commemorate each passing year.

Names of past volumes have included: Kappa Kronicle, Phoenix, Memories, and Katina. The present title, Janus, has only been used since 1976, but its relevance should assure it a long life on the cover of the book of memories of our years at Mount Saint Vincent university.

Janus was the Roman God of beginnings, openings, entrances, doorways; of public gates through which roads passed and of private

doors. Being the God of Gates, he was naturally the God of departures, returns, and by extension, the God of all means of communication. As a yearbook then, Janus represents a departure from the university, as we achieve our goal of graduation, and also a means of returning to it, through memories captured in the words and photos found here. We look to the Janus insignia as a symbol of our progression to the future, and the many thresholds we have yet to cross, and as a symbol of those doors through which we have already passed gaining confidence, wisdom, and pride.

Veritas Ad Deum Ducit is translated as "Truth Leads to God". It is only one of the many aspects of M.S.V.U. that poses greater meaning for those who can appreciate its origin. The motto asserts the religious concerns which inspired the foundation of the University.



The design of a new symbol, to represent the University along with the Heraldic Crest, was approved in January 1971.

The symbol, created by Eagles and Radcliffe Ltd., skillfully combines the letters "M", "V", and "U" to provide a distinctive pattern that is visually appealing and easily remembered. The addition of two circles above this pattern immediately adds warmth and the awareness that the symbol portrays as well.

This, it was felt, was the essence of a university; young people, alert people who are working together towards common objectives.

#### HISTORY OF MOUNT SAINT VINCENT UNIVERSITY

Mount Saint Vincent University is unique in the British Commonwealth. Built by women for women, its roots go back to 1873 when the Sisters of Charity established an academy for girls on the shores of the Bedford Basin. In 1914, an agreement was signed with Dalhousie University allowing the Mount to give the first two years in a bachelor program, the final two years and degree to be given by

In 1925, the Nova Scotia legislature awarded Mount Saint Vincent College the right to grant its own degrees in arts, science and music. A revision to the charter in 1966 made the college a university, and men were first admitted in 1971. The Mount considers the educational needs of women to be a priority, and therefore remains particularly sensitive to the changing needs of women in society. Further, it believes there is a place for a university aimed primarily at the higher education of women, and dedicated to promoting an environment characterized by a Catholic tradition and a size that permits a high degree of personalized instruction. This is the Mount's 60th year as a full degree-granting institution and special events have been planned around this occasion with emphasis on the United Nations' Year of Youth, the end of the UN's Decade of Women and National
