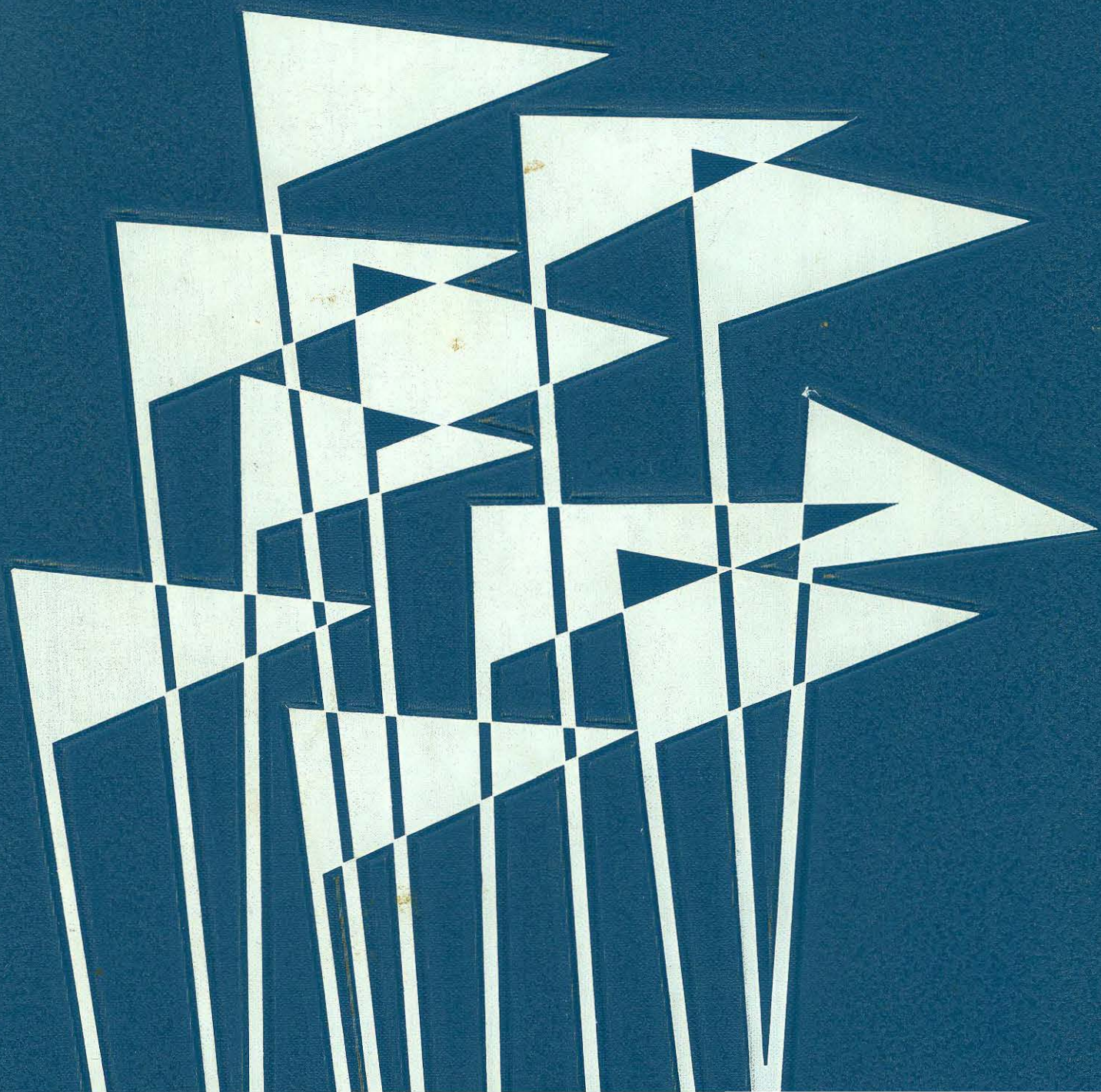

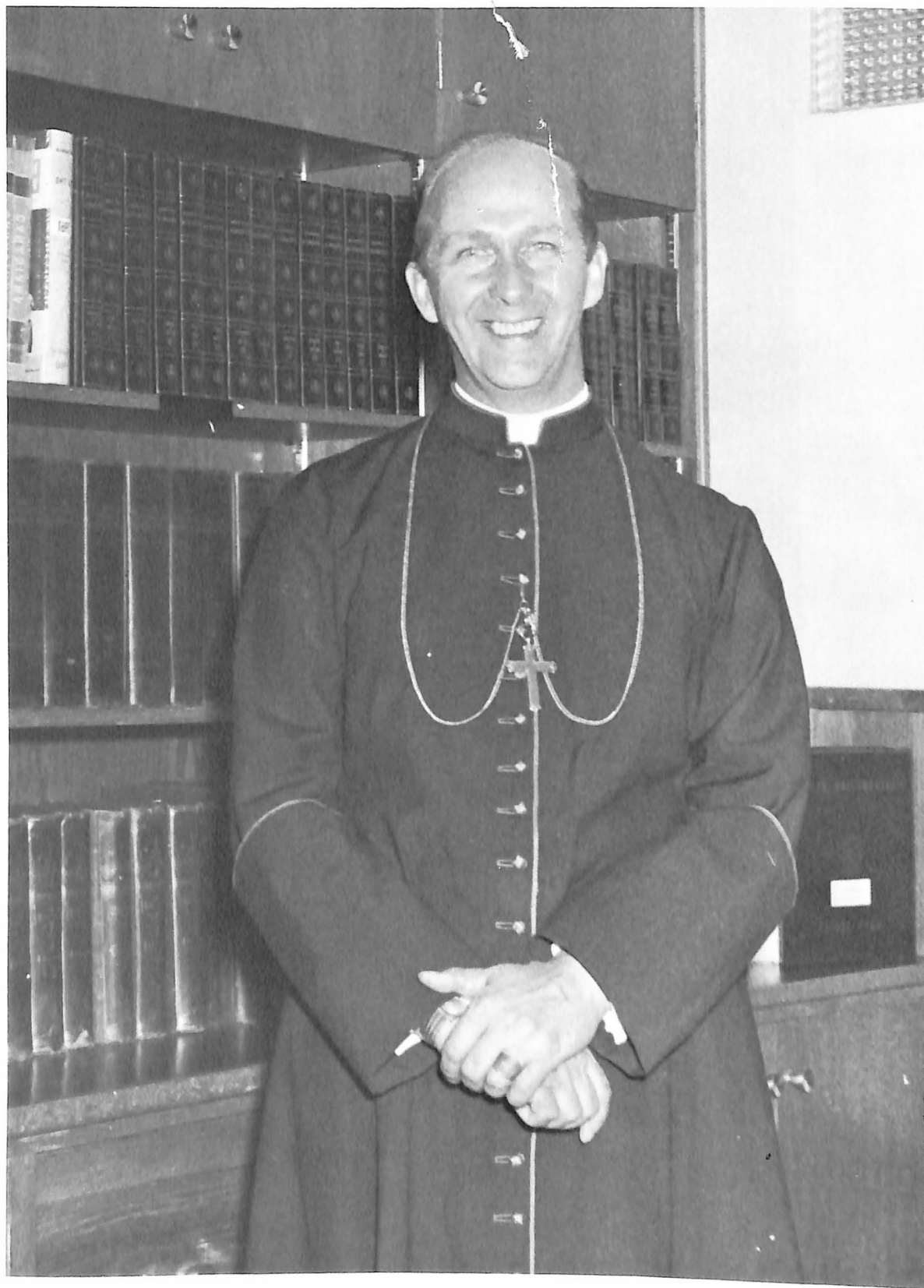

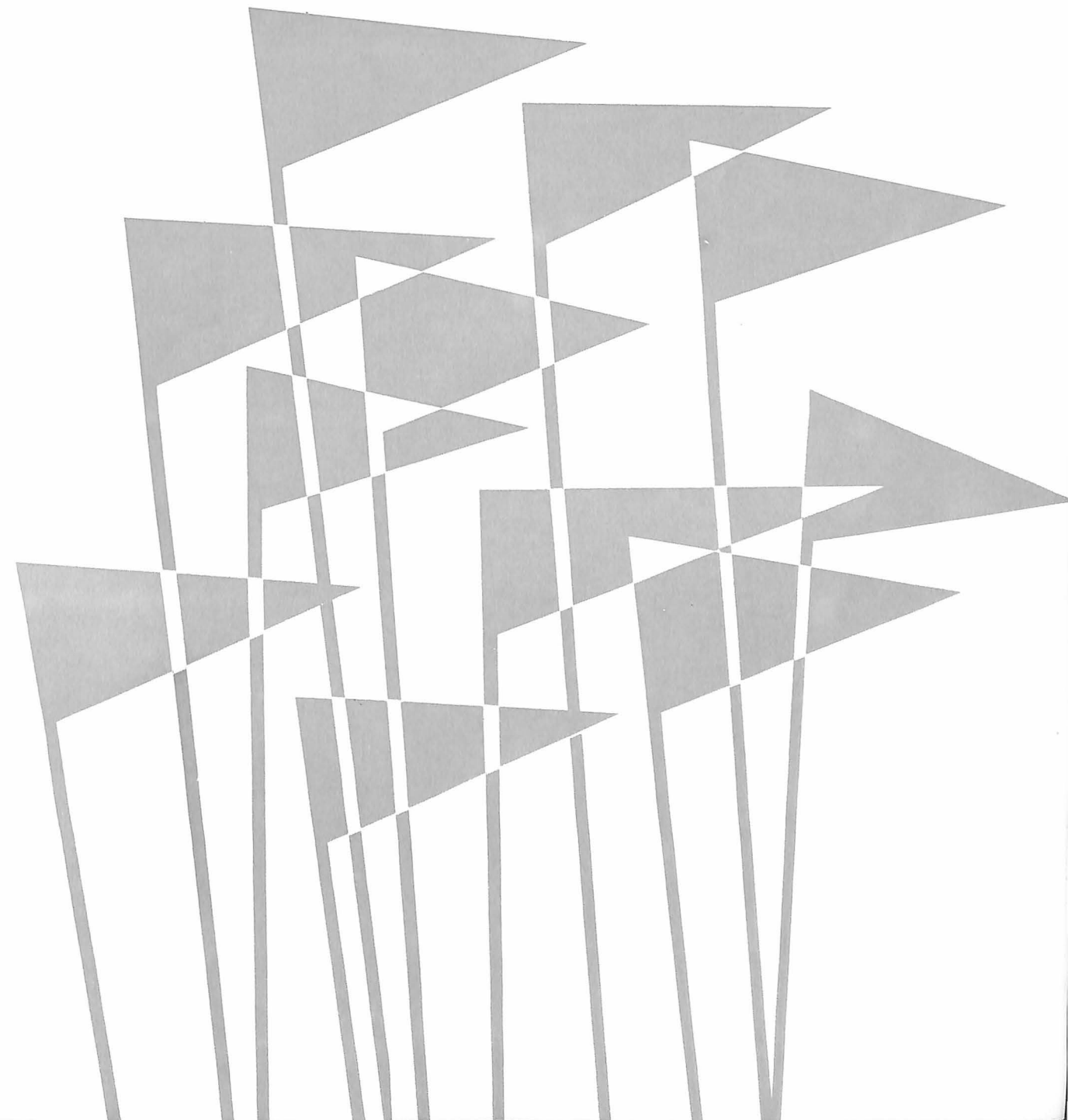


Only a person powered by love of God, a sense of justice, the courage to be different, and a sincere personal dedication to each of her students can assume authority and win respect and affection at the same time.

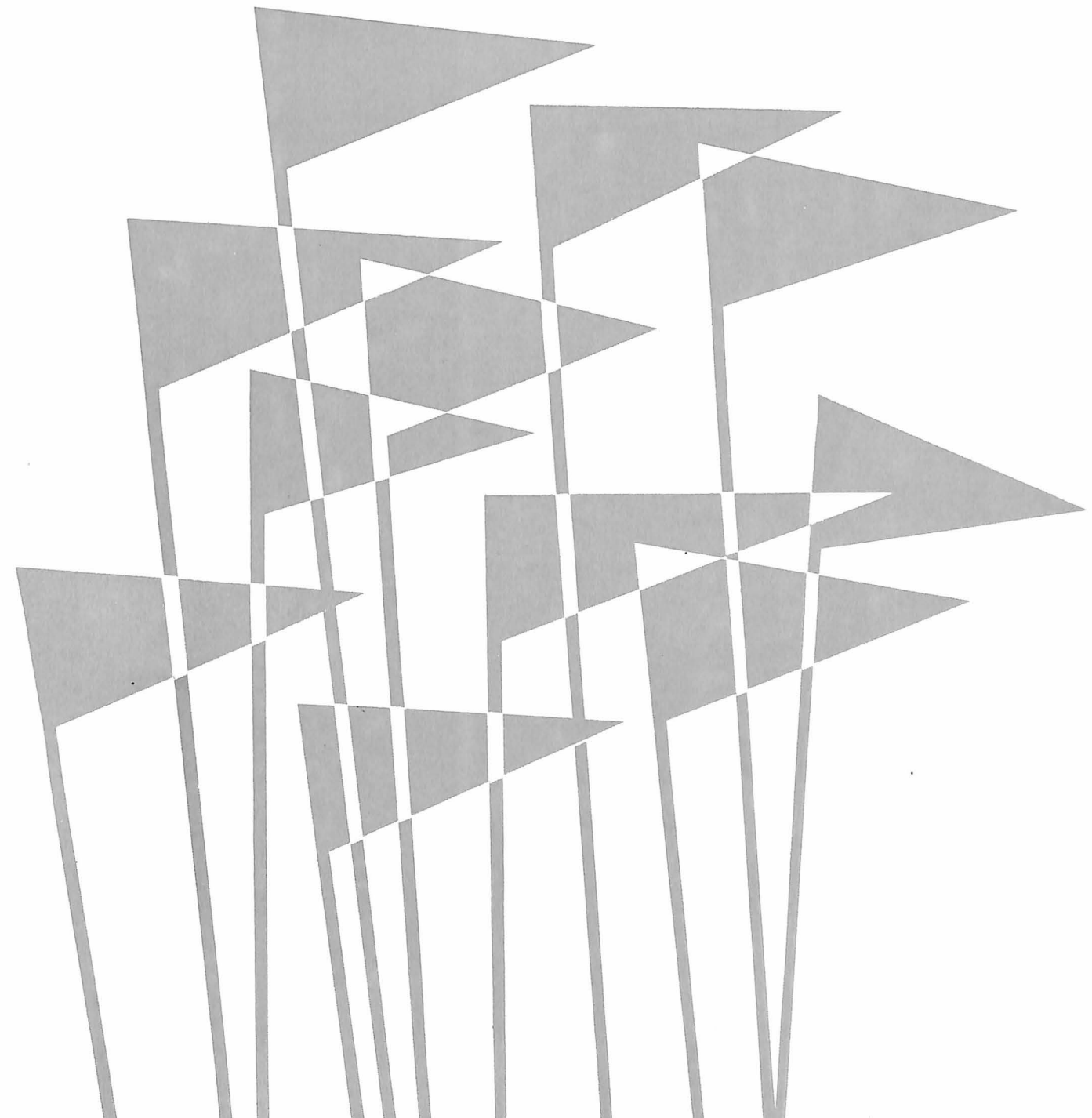
