

Probably the worst record of injuries in the history of any team to compete for the Mount, the team lost 7 key starters to broken ankles, torn knees and unforeseen medical conditions. Players were asked to play positions and systems they had never played before and with each challenge they responded positively.

The team finished the season in second place with a 8-2-2 record. In ACAA semi final play, the team lost 1-0 to third place Holland College in a very evenly matched contest. The Women's Basketball team posted an 11-2 record in the second half of their season and finished the regular season in second place in the ACAA conference with an 18-3 overall record. The team had several injuries throughout the second half but team balance and depth helped see them through the challenging months of January and February. Finishing in one of the two top spots earned the team a first round bye in the conference playoffs held at Holland College March 2-4th, 2012. The team placed second overall in the Championships after losing a very hard fought championship game to St. Thomas University. The team will have a strong returning core for next season and look forward to great success.

MSVU contributed two players to the ACAA All-Conference team. Laura Himmelman was named 2nd Team All-Conference and Chelsea Mackay was voted 1st Team All-Conference, ACAA Player of the Year for the second year running, and she also won the Dyrick McDermott Defensive Player of the Year award. On March 22, 2012 MSVU held the A. Garnet Brown Annual Student Awards banquet. Most improved player was awarded to 2nd year players Taylor MacDonald and Emma Reardon. Most Valuable Player Award went to Chelsea Mackay and the Coach's Award went to Christina Brien. The MacDonald Chisholm Trask Award for Leadership went to 1st year player, Kara Hayes. Chelsea Mackay was awarded the Dyrick McDermott Endowed Leadership award and The Tracy Barton Memorial award was presented to Christina Brien for demonstrating outstanding team spirit. Laura Himmelman was also recognized as an Academic All-Canadian for obtaining a GPA or 3.7 or higher and being named to the Conference All-Star Team. Coach Forward is very excited knowing that all the award winners will be returning next season.

The Mount Men's Basketball team completed the regular season going undefeated with a 21-0 record earning them top spot in the league and a first round bye in the conference playoffs held at Holland College March 2-4, 2012. Throughout the regular season the men's team struggled through several injuries to key players but their trademark defense and team depth helped them to be undefeated in a conference that had five of the eight teams with winning records.

In conference semi-final play the men's team played MTA Mounties. The Mystics took control of the game early and cruised to a 74-50 win which earned them a spot in the championship game for the 8th straight year. The team battled the St.Thomas Tommies in a very entertaining game that went into overtime and resulted in the Tommies coming out on top. The loss to the men's team ended a run of 6 straight ACAA titles. With the ACAA hosting this year's national tournament the men's team qualified to go as the host team. The injuries down the stretch in the regular season and during the national tournament finally took its toll on the team. The team did not qualify for a medal but played hard nonetheless.

As usual the men's team did their part with their contributions to the ACAA All-Conference Teams. Todd Williams was selected 2nd Team ACAA All-Star and recipient of the Dyrick McDermott Defensive Player of the Year. Luke Reynolds and Kenneth Reardon were both selected as ACAA 1stTeam All-Stars. Coach Rick Plato and assistants David Brien and Sean Boulay were selected as Coach and Coaching Staff of the year.

At the A. Garnet Brown Student Awards banquet, the team recognized the following players: Coach's Award went to Graham Carter; Most Improved to Brandon Doyle; MVP to Luke Reynolds.
