
Fashion Production '91 "Kaleidoscope"







Named to the All Conference team were Jennifer Golding, Shelly Eichel and Shelly Snair. Eichel was chosen Most Valueable Player and Snair was honored as Rookie of the Year.



Winning 17 of 22 matches this season, the women's volleyball team trounced the University of King's College in three straight games in the semi-finals. Pitted against the University College of Cape Breton in the final, the Mount defeated UCCB in three straight games to take the NSCAA Championships for the ninth time in 10 years. Julie Roberge, Elaine Collins and Paula Ingarfield were named to the All Conference Team. The team represented the NSCAA in the CCAA Nationals in Quebec City.




Throughout the Year..."

February 1991 marked the tenth anniversary of the opening of the Rosaria Centre and its athletics department. Athletics/Recreation provides the Mount community with sport, fitness, and recreation programs for everyone. Introduced this year was the Active Living Resource Centre which provided educational information on health and fitness.

Whether woman or man, child or senior, all ages and descriptions participated in the Mount programs. Intramural sports such as ball hockey, volleyball, badminton and basketball attracted up to 50 participants on any given night. Instructional classes in Tai Chi and Jazz Dance were very popular. A roster of 22 fitness classes drew an average of 20 participants per class.

All those in the Mount community who supported teams and programs, attended games, competed for the Mount or participated in athletic and recreational events have made the Athletics/Recreation of the Mount a success.





The women's basketball team successfully defended their NSCAA championship, winning 12 of 16 games. Matched against a team from Saint Thomas University in the semi-final, the Mount women emerged victorious with a score of 57-50. Pitted against the Nova Scotia Teachers College in the Final, regulation play ended in a 54-54 tie. The Mount team broke the deadlock in five minutes of overtime play, winning the game 58-56. The Mount team won the NSCAA crown and the right to travel to the CCAA Nationals in British Columbia. Selected to the All Conference team were Alex Taylor, Andrea Drake and Jocelyn MacLean. Coach Anne Lindsay was named NSCAA Coach of the Year and and was honored with the CCAA Coaching Excellence Award for her contributions to the sport.

The strongest team to date of any men's sport at the Mount, the men's basketball team finished the regular season with 17 wins in 20 games. They eliminated the University of King's College Blue Devils in their first championship game and trounced the Nova Scotia Teachers College 44-39 in the final. They earned the right to travel to British Columbia for the CCAA National Basketball championship competition. Tony Ross and Mark Forward were chosen for the All Conference team. Ross was named Rookie of the Year and Forwar was chosen the CCAA All Canadian. Coach Rick Plato was selected NSCAA Coach of the Year.

Valedictory Message Afternoon Ceremony

Madame Vice Chancellor, Honoured guests, Graduating students, congratulations. This is our day. Today we formally celebrate our success at university. We share this celebration with friends, family and faculty. These people have seen and helped us struggle through the years it has taken us to reach this day.

Graduation is a hard earned privilege. We have spent long hours developing our thoughts and skills. We have spent years learning to frame these thoughts in the languages of the disciplines in which we study. We have satisfied the academic standards which developed over centuries.

As university graduates, today we receive recognition for these accomplishments. Our degrees also confer status and responsibility. For this we have paid not only through our work, but also through our pocket books. The cost was high. Many people cannot pay for the opportunity we have had to succeed here. Many of us are in debt. However, many more of us should not be here at all were it not for government subsidies. Funding for both universities and students has steadily decreased during our undergraduate years. Fewer and fewer people have access to post secondary education. If we value our education - if we remember the joy we feel today - we will want a voice in future decisions made about subsidization., Should Free Trade or the GST threaten subsidization we must respond. It is up to us to help future students find the opportunities we have had. In particular, under represented peoples; First Nations People, black people, and ethnic people who want access to university must be encouraged.

Remember, until this century, women were refused access to university. Not because we lacked money. Certainly not because we lacked intelligence. But because men did not want women to obtain the knowledge or the status a university degree confers. Historically, limitation of access to university served the purposes of political elites. The Mount, by its very existence, challenged this tradition. Today our mission statement reads, "Mount Saint Vincent University is concerned primarily with the education of women." This commitment has fostered opportunities for women in Canada and abroad. We see this is the Canada-Nigeria Linkage project.

Studying here, we have witnessed the successes of women in all aspects of university life - from cleaning and maintenance work, to teaching, to management. And, of course, women students abound. We have enjoyed our time here, often because women predominate here.

But we have also known frustration and anger. When 14 women were murdered because they were women attending university, we were shocked. We felt vulnerable. We felt sad. We were outraged by the murder of those women. Now, we share our anger and our grief in annual memorial services. But we must also express this emotion in positive actions which stop violence against women everywhere.

While the Mount is not free of sexism, it is a haven for women. Everyone benefits from this. I have heard both women and men say how glad they are that the atmosphere of "competition for a Friday night date" does not pervade the Mount as it does many universities. Honest friendships develop among students and between students and professors. There is a wonderful rapport here between students, staff, and faculty. We take with us the potential to foster such a spirit in our future endeavours, because we have known it here.

Many of us wonder just how our achievements in university will translate into success in a career. For some, information learned here will become obsolete. Most of us will have to replace our skills in exam and paper writing with other skills. We all have the capacity to do so. Because we spend years learning how to learn. As university graduates, we have excelled in a form of intellectual learning which will serve us throughout our lives. In this we can find confidence and strength to meet the challenges of our tumultuous world.

In this room, we hold a range of opinions about the Gulf War. Collectively, we experienced frustration with our general ignorance of the Middle East, and with the sterile media presentation of the war. Although reporting was constant, information was hidden in military language which called unintended civilian deaths "collateral damage". Here at the Mount, students and professors met to discuss the war. Together we learned how to interpret available information. There is much still to be learned about the Gulf war. Let us continue to use our learning skills to seek truth. Let us admit when our knowledge is limited. Let us communicate with each other despite differences of opinion. Let us apply these skills in our personal relationships, in our work, and in our politics.

We have grown accustomed to speaking out at the Mount. Small classes have encourage this. It is our responsibility to continue speaking out. Many of the positive changes which occurred during our undergraduate years reflect people's insistence that they be heard. Women's protests prevented absolute cuts in funding for women's services. Abuse of First Nations Peoples perpetrated in assimilation schools is now being redressed. Recently, local government has responded to the call for ecological responsibility. Recycling programs are being established.

In these examples we find hope. In their successes, however small, we find inspiration. There is a need and a place for our voices outside this campus. So take pride in your accomplishments at university. Keep with you the learning skills you developed here. Remember your time at the Mount, and make your voices heard in everything you do.


