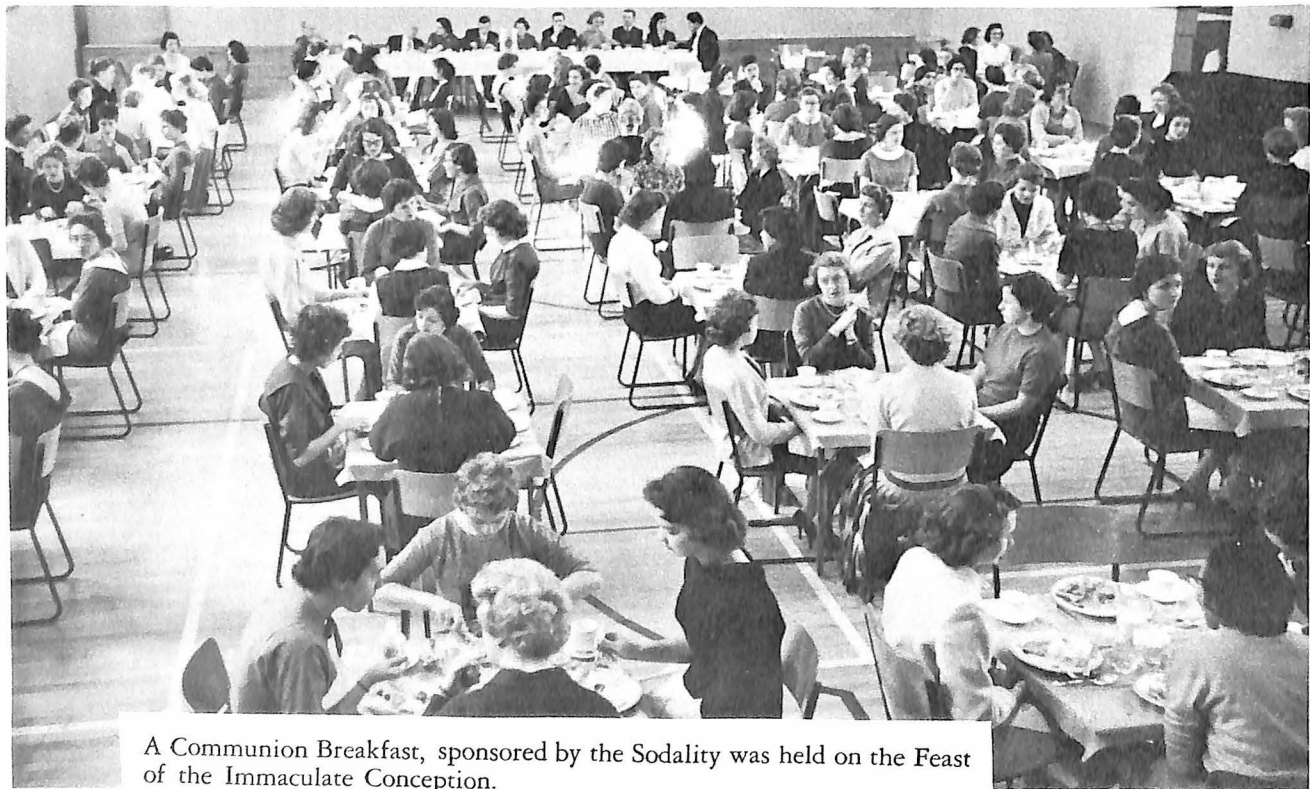

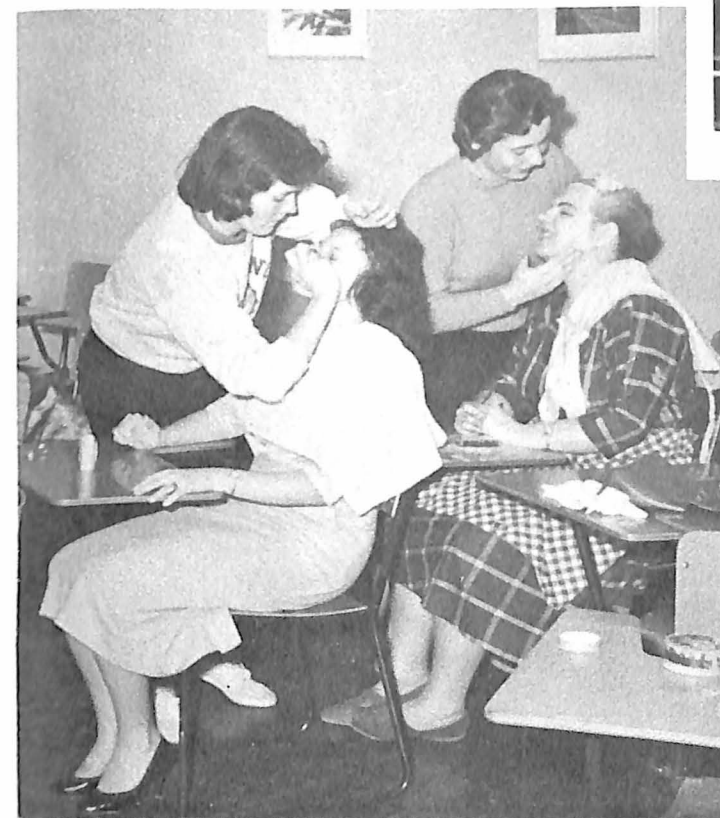




## *"The Play's the thing."*
