DEDICATION

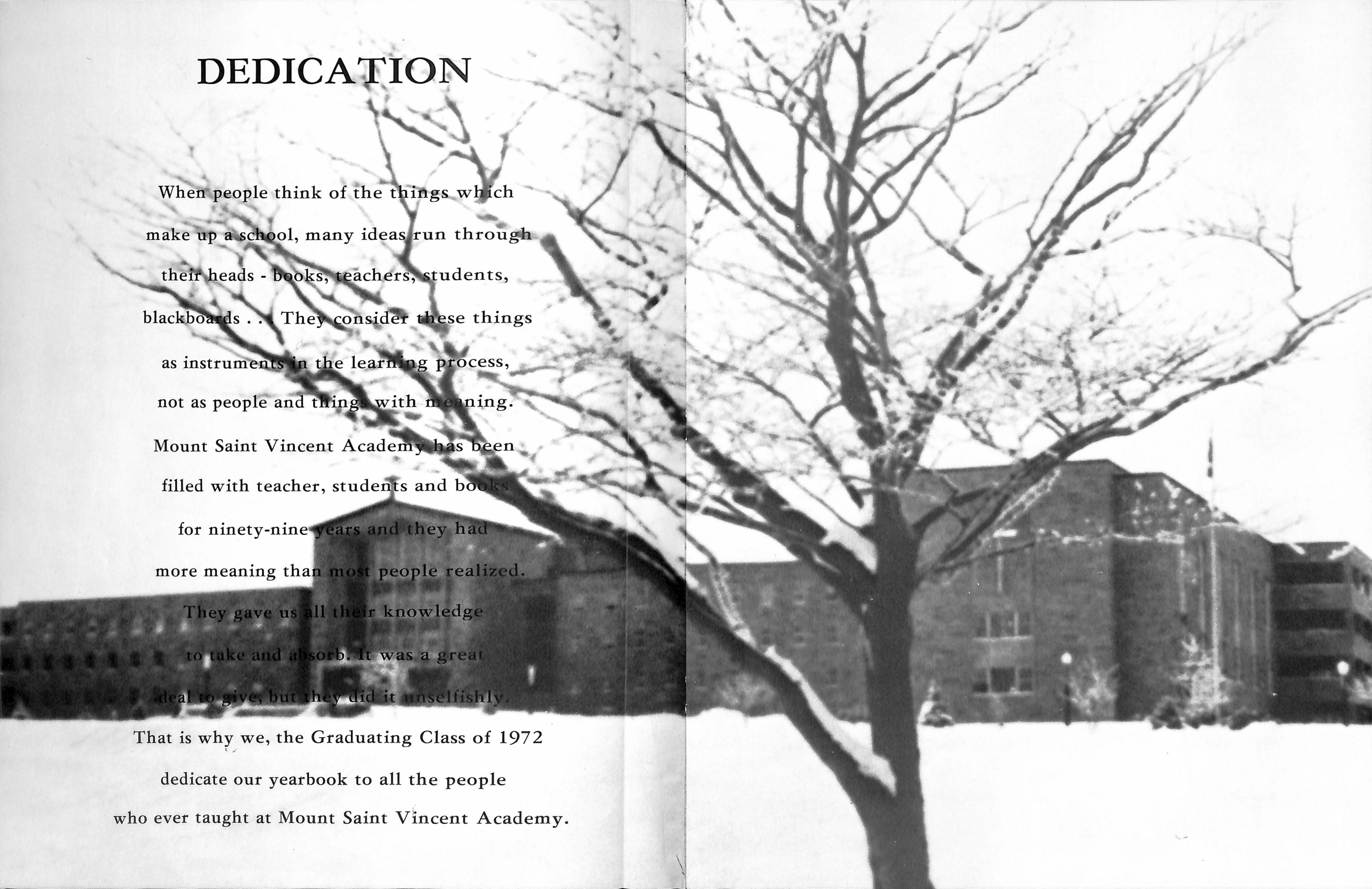

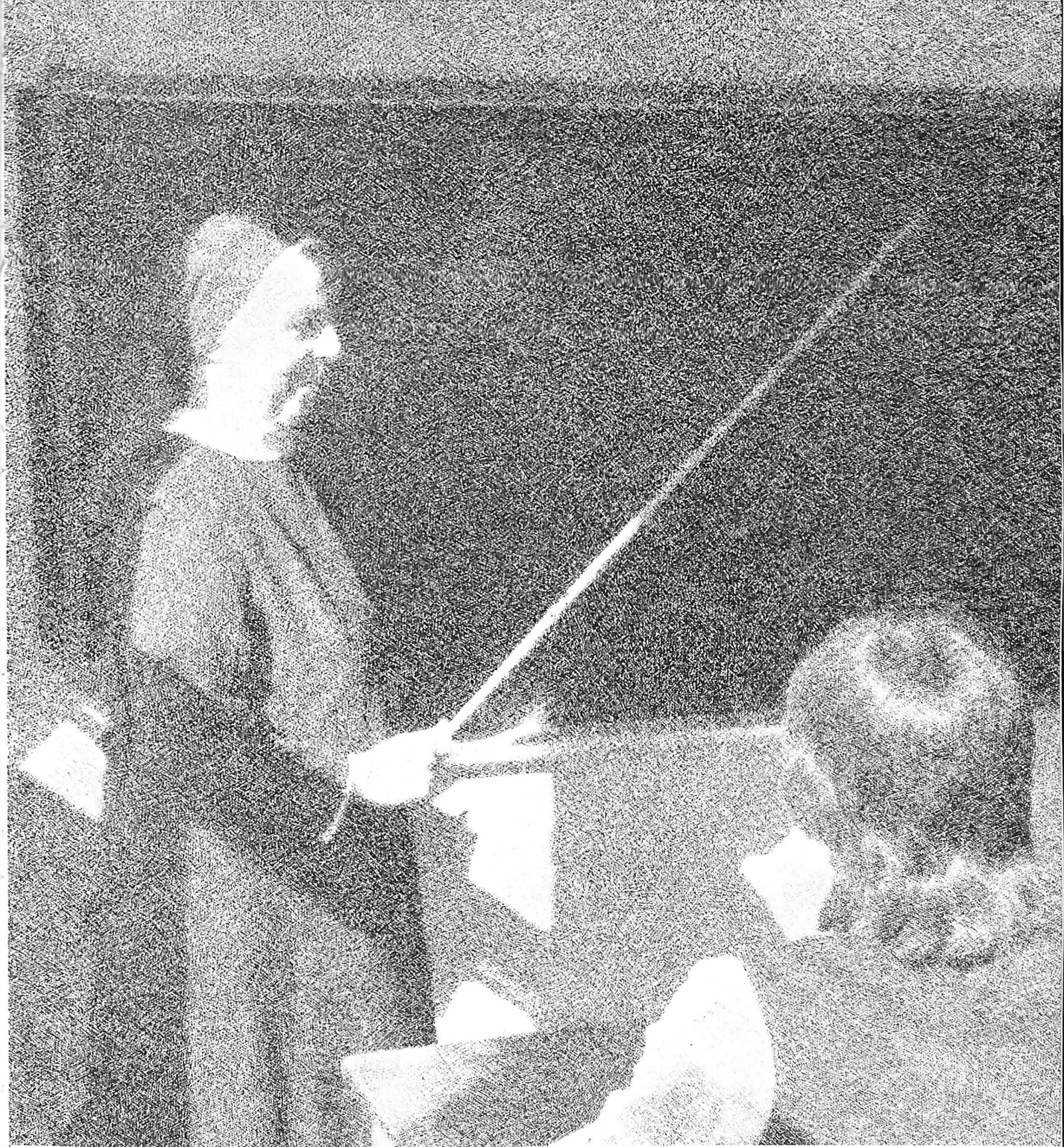
We hope the life span of the Academy has been productive and effective. Like a sturdy tree, it has struck deep roots, more extensive than is visible to the human eye.

JUDITH ANNE BURKE

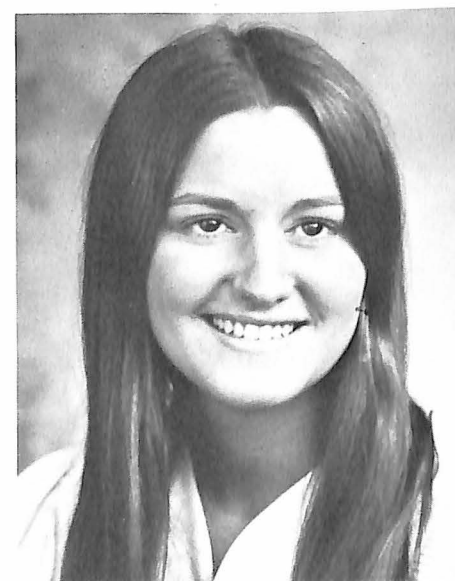
"Oh - the devil got me!"

"Success is relative: the more success, the more relatives."

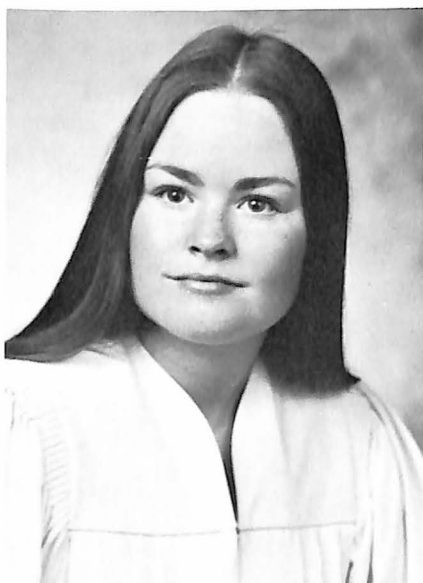

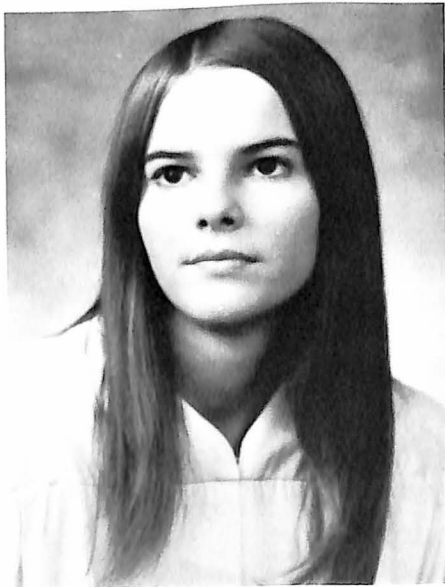
JANE MILLER HOPGOOD

"Today is the tomorrow we worried about yesterday."

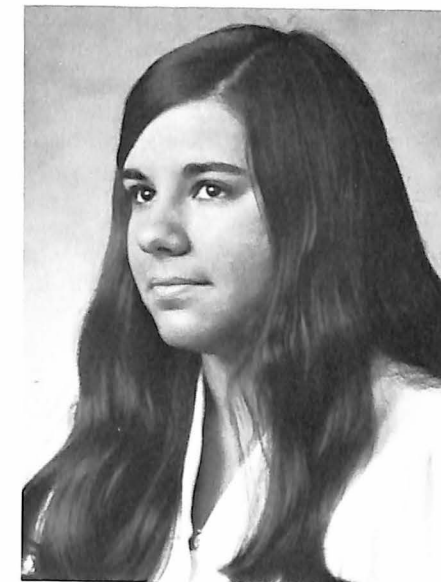

MARGO ALICE THOMAS

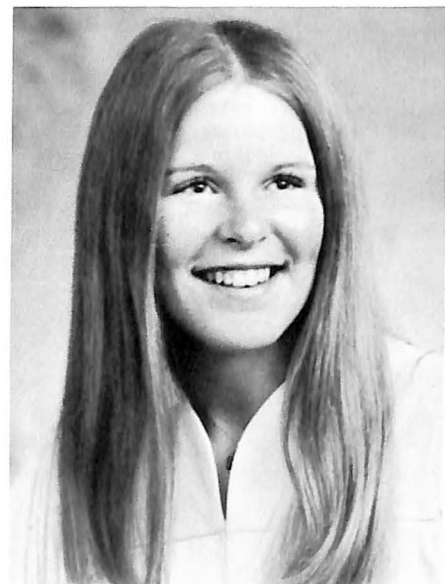
"She came, she saw, she left, and she came back."

Neither be cynical about love; for in the face of all aridity and disenchantment it is perennial as the grass. Take kindly the counsel of the years, gracefully surrendering the things of youth. Nurture strength of spirit to shield you in sudden misfortune. But do not distress yourself with imaginings. Many fears are born of fatigue and loneliness. Beyond a wholesome discipline, be gentle with yourself. You are a child of the universe, no less than the trees and the stars; you have a right to be here. And whether or not it is clear to you, no doubt the universe is unfolding as it should. Therefore be at peace with God, whatever you conceive Him to be, and whatever your labors and aspirations, in the noisy confusion of life keep peace with your soul. With all its sham, drudgery and broken dreams, it is still a beautiful world. Be careful.
