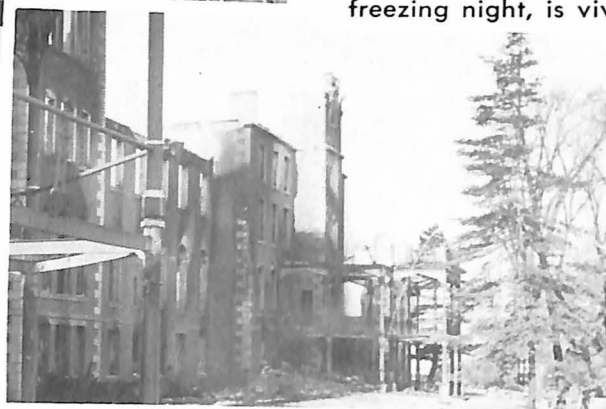
Our High School Years

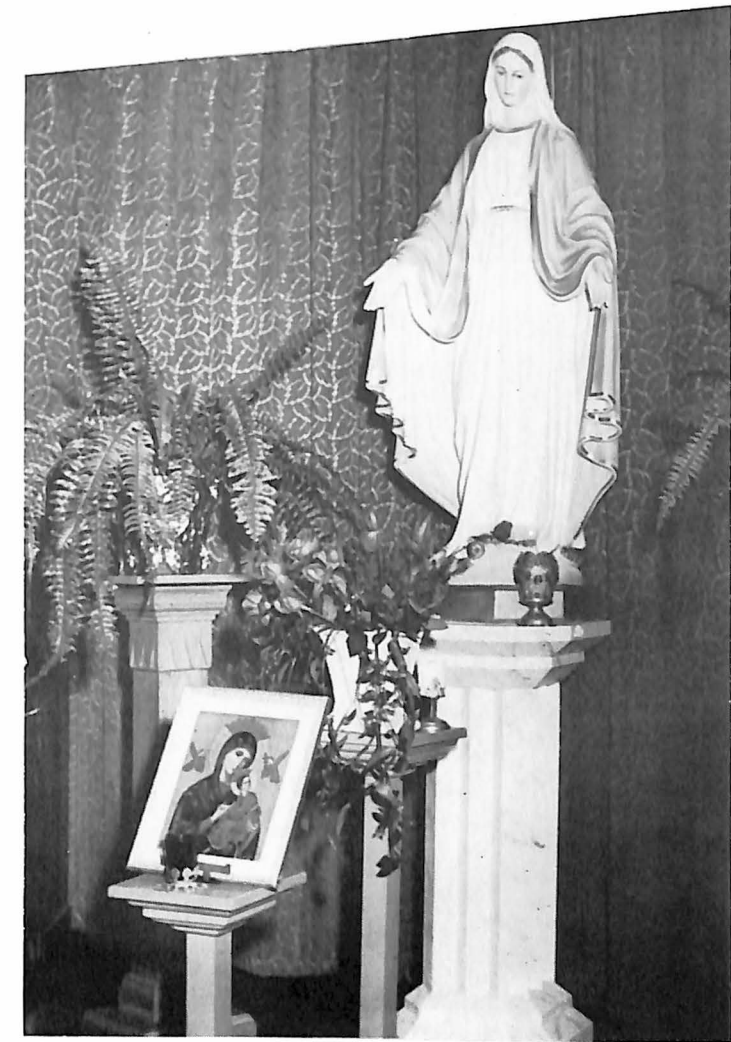
In Memoriam
