Make it six straight ACAA championship titles for the Men's Basketball Program. After a 20-1 regular season win loss record, the men defeated Holland College (the only team to defeat them in the regular season), in the ACAA Championship game to earn their sixth ACAA title in a row. Senior John Caulfield, who was Player of Game in the ACAA championship game, along with Anthony Zinn, Sean Boulay, Luke Reynolds and Todd Williams provided great leadership throughout the season. Todd, Sean and Luke were all named to the ACAA All Conference 1st Team and Anthony Zinn was named to the ACAA All Conference 2nd Team. This year the ACAA launched the Dyrick McDermott Defensive Player of the Year award which was awarded to Todd Williams. Coach Plato and his staff were awarded ACAA Coach of the Year.

The Mount Mystics competed in the CCAA National Championship at Durham College in Ontario. As the 6th seed team out of the eight team tournament, the men faced 3rd seed Humber College, out of Ontario in the first game. The men defeated Humber which set them up for a semi final game against Vanier College out of Quebec. Unfortunately the men came up short in that game but battled their way back against UNBC out of Prince George, BC to earn the right to play for a bronze medal against Vancouver Island University (VIU). This was a back and forth game that came down to the wire with VIU coming out on top 74-72 to capture the bronze. The Mount Men's team finished 4th in the country and represented the ACAA extremely well again this year.

The team will say goodbye to three seniors this year. Anthony Zinn, Sean Boulay and John Caulfield will graduate this year with a combined, 13 ACAA championships, one CCAA silver banner and impressive win loss record of 112-3 in ACAA play while in a Mystic uniform. We wish them all the best in their future endeavors after they graduate. The Men's team are in good hands for future success by returning 12 players from this year's team and will look to continue with their unprecedented success.


