

## Selections Committee To Hire SU Executive

At a recent closed-door meeting of The Picaro staff, columnist J. Wingo put forth a motion calling for the Mount's student council executive to be hired through a selections committee. The motion was passed 27 to 0 with no abstentions.

"This is ridiculous!" said council president, Dave Wynn. "This is obviously an attempt to control us!"

"I second that!" added External VP Shauna MacNeil.

Brainstem creator and news editor Joe Strolz denies this accusation. "I am disappointed the council is upset by this. We certainly don't want control. Yes, we suggested the committee. Yes, we'll decide on the make-up of the committee, and, yes, we'll inflict severe pain if they go against our policies. But control? That's absurd!"

"We gave the issue more than enough thought," stated media columnist Bob LeDrew. "Besides, we had more important issues to discuss -- like the Mia and Woody thing ... now THAT's important."

The council also expressed displeasure over their lack of representation on the selections committee. The council feels the committee as described by the Picaro, would not

be the best qualified to hire the executive.

"What does David Letterman or a selections committee of that nature know about hiring the executive of the student council?" murmurred Internal VP Karen Dean.

Paula Adamski, Picaro editor-in-chief, sees the selections committee as having fair council representation. "Greg Frampton, the Picaro's poet, is also a member of council. That is more than enough council representation. We are being very generous with council on this matter."

Vinnie's D.J. Kevin Fraser sees it differently. "My friends! What are you doing to my friends?!" he wailed.

When asked if the Picaro would ever consider rescinding the motion, CUP editor Josette Marchand replied, "Not as long as I'm in office!"

"They won't get away with this!" Wynn vowed. "This is outrageous! What if the council proposed a committee to hire the editor of the paper! How would they like that?"

## MSVU English Prof Counsels Yeltsin

Mount English professor, David Monaghan, has submitted a proposal to Russian president Boris Yeltsin outlining a plan for the reestablishment of a communist regime. This 127 page paper blames the fall of communism for what Monaghan calls "a disintegration of North American culture."

The secret paper, titled Hey, Put That Wall Back, was obtained by the Picaro staff.

"Mr. Yeltsin, you must understand the bigger picture," the proposal reads. "The end of communism has brought with it the end of the great contemporary novel. President Yeltsin was not available for comment.

#### **SMUSA Execs Impeached**


