Were it not for Sister Maura, FOLIA MONTANA might never have been, for it was through her efforts that the first edition was published in 1915. Therefore, it is only fitting that we, who have inherited the traditions of Folia Montana reflect for a moment on her memory.

On January 16, heaven claimed the soul of a woman who during her lifetime had gained international recognition as a poet and critic of outstanding quality. Sister was one of the original organizers of the Halifax School of Journalism affiliated with three Halifax universities including her own Mount Saint Vincent College.

Her death was a sad blow to all of us and yet we are comforted in the knowledge that an artist never goes far from us but stays ever near, ever present in her cherished work. To you, Sister Maura, we humbly and lovingly dedicate our memories.

To The Graduates

My dear Graduates:

There is one quality of heart which I would counsel you especially to cultivate and cherish all the days of your life — it is unselfishness. Now, selfishness is nothing other than the worship of one's pleasure; this it is which makes you unmindful of the God Whose friend you are destined to be. His commands, the remembrance of His love for you, are ignored when the allurements of self-gratification are heeded, and yet, how short-lived and empty are the sinful pleasures for which so great a destiny is ignored! And on the other hand, what peace of soul in time, what joy and happiness in eternity are the reward of self-denial!

In your dealings with your neighbor, there is a strict obligation of justice and charity; this, a practised and fostered selfishness can make you forget. Another's rights will be ignored if they interfere with your ambition for riches, for honors, for pleasure. But an honest admission of the neighbor's right will call, at times, for great self-restraint that hurts, but also blesses.


Even self can be seriously wounded in a struggle where self-indulgence is allowed to dominate. We must recognize that the human heart is a seething cauldron of passions, each in turn clamoring for recognition and domination, but if you honestly admit to yourself that these are shameful suggestions and you promptly reject them, you will experience the joy that is ever the companion of truth.

In Saint Paul's words, then, I would admonish you to "walk as children of the light, for the fruit of the light is goodness, justice, and truth."
