Peace: I think you were chosen, Joy, because you are a part of every grace. You have been Sister Miriam Vincent's companion for many years, and besides, what is a party without joy?

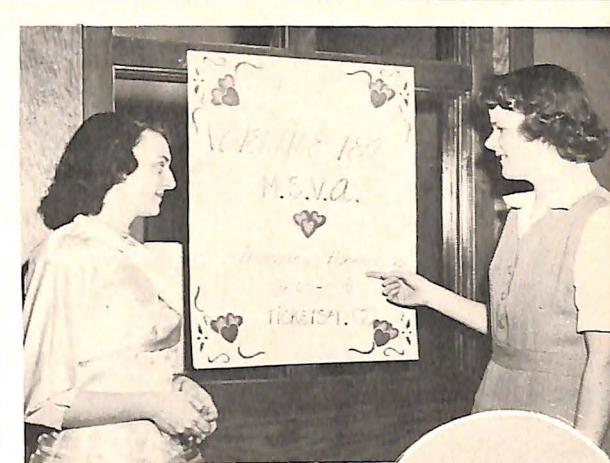
Joy: Thank you, Peace, but I would like to know who the messengers are who bring you gifts.
