



The Mount Mystics Women's Volleyball team came into the season with the goal of defending its title as defending ACAA Champions from 2011-2012. Although the team lost some key players, there was a solid base of returning players plus Coach Brooks was able to recruit two of the top high school players in the Maritimes: Christina Day from Balls Creek, NS and Sydney Foy, from Cornwall PEI.

The team went 18-0 in league play and placed third in the Limoilou tournament in Quebec in January. The team went into the ACAA Championships ranked number one and defeated 4th ranked Universite Ste Anne 3 straight: 25-14, 25-16, 25-19. The ACAA Final was a rematch of the year before with , MSVU facing the STU Tommies. The Mount played with purpose and determination and defeated STU convincingly 25-16, 25-18, 25-14.

At the ACAA Championships, the Mount had an unheard five players make the ACAA All Conference Teams. Haley MacDonald and Kelcie Levesque made second team ACAA ALL Conference and Meaghan MacDougall, Chanelle Prerodovich and Christina Day were named to the First Team ACAA All Conference. Christina Day also won ACAA Rookie of the Year and Head Coach Derrick Brooks was name ACAA Coach of the Year for the third consecutive year.

The team travelled to Lakeland College, Vermillion, Alberta where the team played extremely well and finished 5th overall. It was an another exceptional year for the Mount Mystics Womens Volleyball program.

The 2012-2013 edition of the Women's basketball Varsity team featured seven returning players and a rookie class of six. Essentially is was billed as a rebuilding season with so many new players. The season started with the annual Montreal preseason trip to play some of the top teams in the top conference in the country followed by attending the Moncton Ladies Classic a week later where the team played against the top CIS schools in Atlantic Canada. Although the team did not win any games in the preseason it helped to prepare them for a very touch regular season schedule where they played more road games than home games. The regular season had its share of adversities with injuries to key players leading the way. However with a determined group of first and second year players and being led by co-captain and fourth year player Christina Brien the team finished with a 16-5 record and good for second place and a bye in the first round of the conference play-offs. The conference championships saw the team play University of Kings College in the semifinals with the team coming out on top with a 15 point win and set the team up to play for a fourth straight championship ship game with the top ranked and undefeated St. Thomas Tommies. Playing on the Tommies home floor proved to be too much for the team to handle and the second ranked team national put an end to any title hopes this season. The team wasn't finished though. As a wild card spot was made available to the team they were able to attend the CCAA National tournament held at the Dalhousie University, Agricultural Campus in Truro, NS. At the eight seed the team faced the top ranked and eventual gold medal champions Montmorency Nomades in the first round, Ontario Champions in the second and the Ontario wildcard on day three. All games were hard fought, which included a loss and overtime loss and ended with a win to finish in seventh spot at the end of the tournament. The team was very happy with the way they competed at the National level and feel fortunate for the experience and will use it to build upon going into next year. The team also said a final farewell to fifth year guard Chelsea MacKay. Chelsea leaves the varsity scene and will work to completer her degree in Education.

Rookies Ryan MacPhee and Emad Khalek also had great first years and together the entire team gelled and went 17-4 in league play. They placed second overall and lost a heartbreaker in overtime to St Thomas Tommies in semi final play at the ACAA Championships. Kenneth Reardon earned an ACAA 1st All Conference Team award. The team is already looking forward to next season.

In May, the Mount Mystics said farewell to long time Mount Mystics Coach, Rick Plato. After 25 years of coaching the Mount Mystics Men's Basketball and 27 years of teaching at Charles P. Allan High School, Rick will retire from both to focus on his coaching career with Dalhousie University. He has accepted the Head Coach position for the Dalhousie Tigers Men's Basketball Team.

Coach Plato started with the Mount Mystics in 1988 and during this time he led the Mystics to 14 appearances at CCAA national championships, including two CCAA national medals. His teams have won 13 ACAA conference championships and they have been CCAA semifinalists in six of the last eight seasons. Rick has been named ACAA Coach of the Year on 13 occasions and received the national CCAA Coach of the Year honour in 2009.



Coach Plato has created a lasting legacy that will never be forgotten. His leadership, passion and dedication has shaped our mens basketball program and we are truly grateful for his years of commitment to the Mount Mystics Men's Basketball Program. 

The Mount women's soccer team saw a talented group take the field this season under direction of head coach Colin Steeves and assistant coach Morgan LeBlanc. The team ended league play in second place with seven wins, one tie and two losses. The team scored 32 goals while only conceding five. The ladies met University of Kings College in ACAA semi-final playoff action and earned a decisive 3-1 victory that sent them to the championship game versus the undefeated Holland College Hurricanes. The women won 1-0 and became ACAA champions, giving them a seat at the national championships in PEI where they had a strong showing.

The women earned two first team all- conference spots held by Emily Burke and Sara Reid while Danielle Cyr, Stephanie Dockrill and Jessica Oliver-Hill earned second team all- conference status. For her exceptional leadership, work ethic and skill, Burke was named MVP of the league for the second year in a row and was recognized as a CCAA All-Canadian. Burke was also named MSVU Female Athlete of the Year. Cyr was awarded the ACAA Gerry LeBlanc Award and was named a SIRC-CCAA Academic All-Canadian.

Burke, Dockrill and Reid played their last season with the Mystics along with Chrissy Hennebury, Sarah Parker, and Katie MacPherson. The team wishes its graduates well and thanks them for their time and effort. With much admiration, the girls also say goodbye to coach Steeves who will not be returning for the 2013-2014 season. Steeves has been with the program for the past five years. The girls and athletic department wish him the best and are excited to welcome new head coach Matt Holton. Holton comes with a wealth of playing experience and is currently part of the technical staff of Halifax City Soccer Club.
