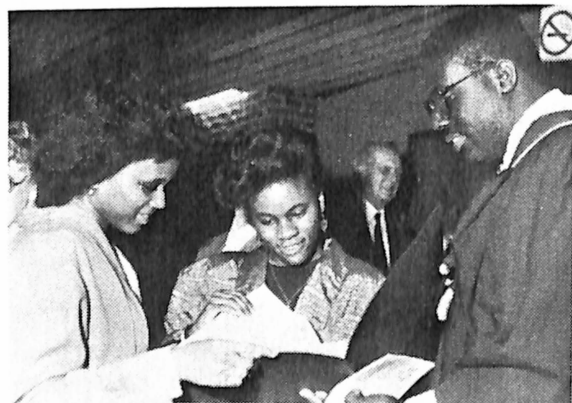

Mount celebrates 1989 Fall Convocation

The Mount celebrated its 1989 Fall Convocation and Scholars Assembly on Sunday, Oct. 22. Eighty-three students received degrees, diplomas and certificates conferred by Senate on June 19 and October 6. Another 72 students received their degrees in absentia. In addition, almost 230 Mount students who attained the Deans' List for the 1988-89 academic year and who have been awarded scholarships for the 1989-90 academic year were recognized.

The ceremony marked the culmination of National Universities Week at the

Mount, highlighted by the annual For the Run of It fundraiser for AdSum House, the official opening of the E. Margaret Fulton Communications Centre, the Fulton Lecture Series, the opening of the Africville exhibition at the art gallery, and the traditional Baccalaureate Mass.

An honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree was conferred upon well-known Canadian broadcast journalist Betty Kennedy, who addressed the graduates. Dr. Chitra Reddin, Mount public relations

President Hersom's remarks at Fall Convocation

In her remarks at Fall Convocation, Mount President Dr. Naomi Hersom reflected upon the activities of National Universities Week, which culminated with Convocation. "We began on Monday with the official opening of the E. Margaret Fulton Communications Centre -- a building designed to open the way to the world of ideas more easily and more extensively through our library, through the effective use of computers, television, and other audio-visual media."

She applauded the Fulton Lecture Series as having "opened our minds to the world of ideas about who we are as a university and what we can be. It is indeed prime time for us to review our curriculum, to ensure that we as scholars open our minds to new ways of thinking about our planet and its people, our responsibilities and our relationships to one another, a world that includes women's ideas and creativity."

Dr. Hersom described the Women in

Academia forum, sponsored by the Students' Union of Nova Scotia, as an opportunity to come "face to face with the world as it is today for many women in universities."

The Africville exhibition which opened at the Mount art gallery October 20 "is a potent reminder to all of us of possibilities for future actions which can, and must be, prevented from happening," she said.

She noted that the Fall Convocation "is a recognition of the growth that has taken place at this university and of the forward-looking changes we have introduced into our programs such as co-operative education work terms."

In closing, Dr. Hersom remarked, "The quality of a university resides in its people -- who speak not only of our rights but also of responsibilities, and of wrongs that must be put right. May the people who are Mount Saint Vincent University be the people whose thoughts and actions turn that mission into a reality."

Communication is theme of Kennedy's address

The value of communication was the theme of broadcast journalist Betty Kennedy's address to Mount grads after she accepted an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree at Fall Convocation. The theme was in keeping with the recent opening of the E. Margaret Fulton Communications Centre, to which Kennedy paid tribute.

"The one skill necessary to us all is the ability to communicate," she said. "It is having the intuitive sensitivity to others; the perception to know what effect your words may have on someone else; the courage to voice deeply-held convictions in a persuasive, rather than antagonistic, manner; the generosity to say the kind and complimentary word as quickly as the critical; and that rare ability to listen."

She noted that self-respect and respect for others is essential for communication.

"To comprehend and cherish one's own individuality is to begin to comprehend and cherish others."

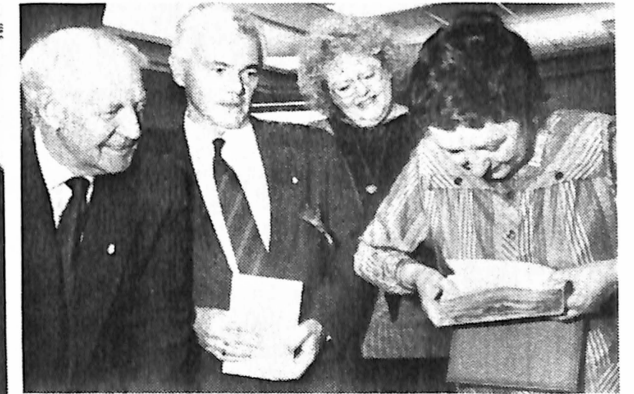
She spoke of the necessity of having a personal vision. "Just as your university began with a vision, you must have a vision of your own for which you must be prepared to fight." She urged graduates to believe in themselves. "The most serious limitations you will ever encounter are those you impose on yourself."

Kennedy said in closing, "May you go on to add strength to strength. May the years ahead be filled with satisfaction in your work, warmth and laughter in your play, and always a sense of curiosity and eagerness to continue in this great adventure called life. Thank you, Mount Saint Vincent University, for this rewarding episode in mine."

New Communications Centre officially opened

"A library that is also a communications centre represents hope for the future," remarked former Mount president Dr. E. Margaret Fulton at the official opening of the Mount's communications centre named in her honor, on October 16.

The event was well attended by the Mount community and friends who came to celebrate the new building, which is 89 percent funded by the provincial government, and to honor Dr. Fulton for her role in spearheading the project.

Joining Dr. Fulton in the official party were The Most Reverend James M. Hayes, Archbishop of Halifax; Premier John Buchanan; advanced education minister Joel Matheson; Member of Parliament and Mount alumna Mary Clancy; Halifax mayor Ron Wallace; alderman Bill Stone; Mount Board of Governors chair Dale Godsoe; and Mount president Dr. Naomi Hersom.

In her opening remarks, Dr. Hersom said that in creating the new centre "we

have had to learn how to bring together the qualities and strengths of library, computer and media sciences in order to create a facility for people, for scholarship, for reaching out to the people in Nova Scotia, and to the world (quite literally through Distance University Education via Television)."

Alderman Stone, Mayor Wallace, and Mary Clancy praised the new building, in turn, as, "enhancing the excellence that we've come to expect of Mount Saint Vincent University", "at the crest of the wave of the information revolution", and "a victory and a celebration for women".

Dale Godsoe added that one Mount student had remarked to her, "I've spent more time in the new library in the last month than I had in the old library over the last four years."

Premier Buchanan praised Dr. Fulton for her leadership and her vision. He talked

Two new agreements have been reached by Canada's education ministers and the federal government. The announcement was made by the Honourable Ron Giffin, Nova Scotia's Minister of Education and chair of the Council of Ministers of Education Canada (CMEC), at the close of the recent 55th Council meeting in Toronto.

Giffin commented on a new protocol regarding the development of national education statistics. "If we are to maintain excellence in our education systems, we must have a good picture of what is going on and that is only possible with reliable data."

The CMEC also announced that it has reached an agreement with the Secretary of State and the Secretary of State for External Affairs to jointly set up a commission to implement in Canada the Unesco Convention on the Recognition of Degrees and Diplomas.

The commission will collect information on Canadian and foreign degrees and diplomas and make it available to international students wishing to study in Canada, Canadian students wishing to study abroad, educational institutions and prospective employers. Giffin noted that the project, when completed, "will provide a useful tool to assist all those involved in education in assessing the performance of their education programs in comparison with standards acceptable to all provinces."

Employment Services Canada has awarded the Mount's Centre for Continuing Education its third contract, in the amount of \$37,000, to operate additional Job-Finding Clubs for Older Workers. The first series of five clubs was the only one of its kind in Nova Scotia to assist severely disadvantaged women and men 45 years of age and older. Three-quarters of the 45 workers who participated found employment.

The Job-Finding Clubs for Older

Workers will operate from the Crichton Community Centre in Dartmouth.

The opening of the Africville exhibition at the Mount art gallery was attended by nearly 500 people, including members of the Africville community and representatives of the Africville Genealogy Society; the Black Cultural Centre for Nova Scotia; the National Film Board Atlantic Centre; federal, provincial and municipal governments; and the Mount. Dr. Bridglal Pachai, director of the Nova Scotia Human Rights Commission, was master of ceremonies, and former Africville pastor, Rev. Donald B. Skeir, offered a prayer. The exhibition, funded by the federal Department of Communications with assistance from the N.S. Department of Tourism and Culture, continues at the art gallery until November 19, after which it tours nationally.

Fulton Lecture Series touches on profound issues

Guest speakers for the recent Fulton Lecture Series discussed key concerns of the Mount and the university community in general. Speaking on the woman's voice in the library, past Mount president Dr. E. Margaret Fulton noted, "I believe that by focusing on women and the spiritual dimension of our common humanity, the Mount can make a difference. You are in a privileged position to give new leadership in the world of academia and communicate your ideas to a larger society."

Sociologist Thelma McCormack spoke about women's studies programs and other key trends in university development, and the need for university education to reflect the reality of today's students.

Maureen O'Neil, an expert in

Canada's relationship with developing countries, spoke on Canadian Universities and the Poor Countries: Beyond Partnership, urging more generous federal government policies toward developing countries.

Concurrent with the lecture series, a panel discussion on Women and Education: The 1990s and Beyond was broadcast throughout Atlantic Canada via the Atlantic Satellite Network (ASN). Panelists were Dr. E. Margaret Fulton; Thelma McCormack; Dr. Joyce Kennedy, acting director of the Mount's Centre for Continuing Education; and writer and Acadia University English department faculty member Donna Smyth. Sue McGregor, Mount home economics faculty member, was moderator.

Presidents meet to discuss Canada-U.S. questions

Presidents of the Association of Atlantic Universities met at the Mount recently with their New England counterparts. The six presidents of the New England Land-Grant Universities joined the 19 Atlantic university presidents in discussing student and faculty exchanges, Canadian-American program and research collaboration, and atmospheric, environmental and oceanographic issues.

Speaking at a dinner following the meeting, Dr. Gil Winham, Dalhousie University political science faculty member, briefed the New England presidents on Canadian perspectives on the recently signed Free Trade Agreement.

Dr. Dale Lick, president of the University of Maine and chair of the New England Council of Presidents, characterized the meetings as "a most useful introduction to the potential for co-operation among the institutions." He stated that common interests in a number of areas will encourage joint projects, and faculty and student exchanges.

Dr. Willie Eliot, president of the University of Prince Edward Island and chair of the Association of Atlantic Universities, said that the meetings allowed the presidents to focus on areas where increased contact between the groups and

between universities should produce results of benefit to the provinces and states represented at the meeting.

The presidents agreed to meet again, to encourage more people from their universities to be involved in Canadian-American questions, and to continue to seek opportunities for mutual co-operation.

about Dr. Fulton's perseverance in obtaining funding for the communications centre, and pointed out that Dr. Hersom continues the campaign. The Honourable Joel Matheson noted, "Under her term, the Mount became a leader among Nova Scotia universities in dispelling the myth that universities are ivory towers, far removed from the concerns of business and industry, as well as those of ordinary citizens. I am positive that the E. Margaret Fulton Communications Centre will meet this university's expectations and live up to the reputation of the remarkable woman after whom it has been named."

The final word was reserved for Dr. Fulton, who reminded guests that "what we see today, as impressive as it is, is only a part of the culmination of the efforts of many, many people. The unseen part represents the knowledge, the skills, the

appreciation, the thoughtfulness, the discoveries and the creativity of all those who come in person or by computer and telecommunications lines."

Dr. Fulton and Premier Buchanan unveiled a plaque commemorating the official opening. Tours of the building were conducted by student volunteers, and demonstrations were offered by library, computing and communications technologies, DUET and audio-visual staff. Following the official opening, guests were invited to join in a tree-planting tradition. Dr. Fulton donated trees in honor of the opening of the Centre, and in honor of two of the people who helped her during her term as president: Dorothy West, as secretary to the president; and Ruth Goldbloom, as chair of the Mount's first capital fund-raising campaign, Project One: Futures for Women.
