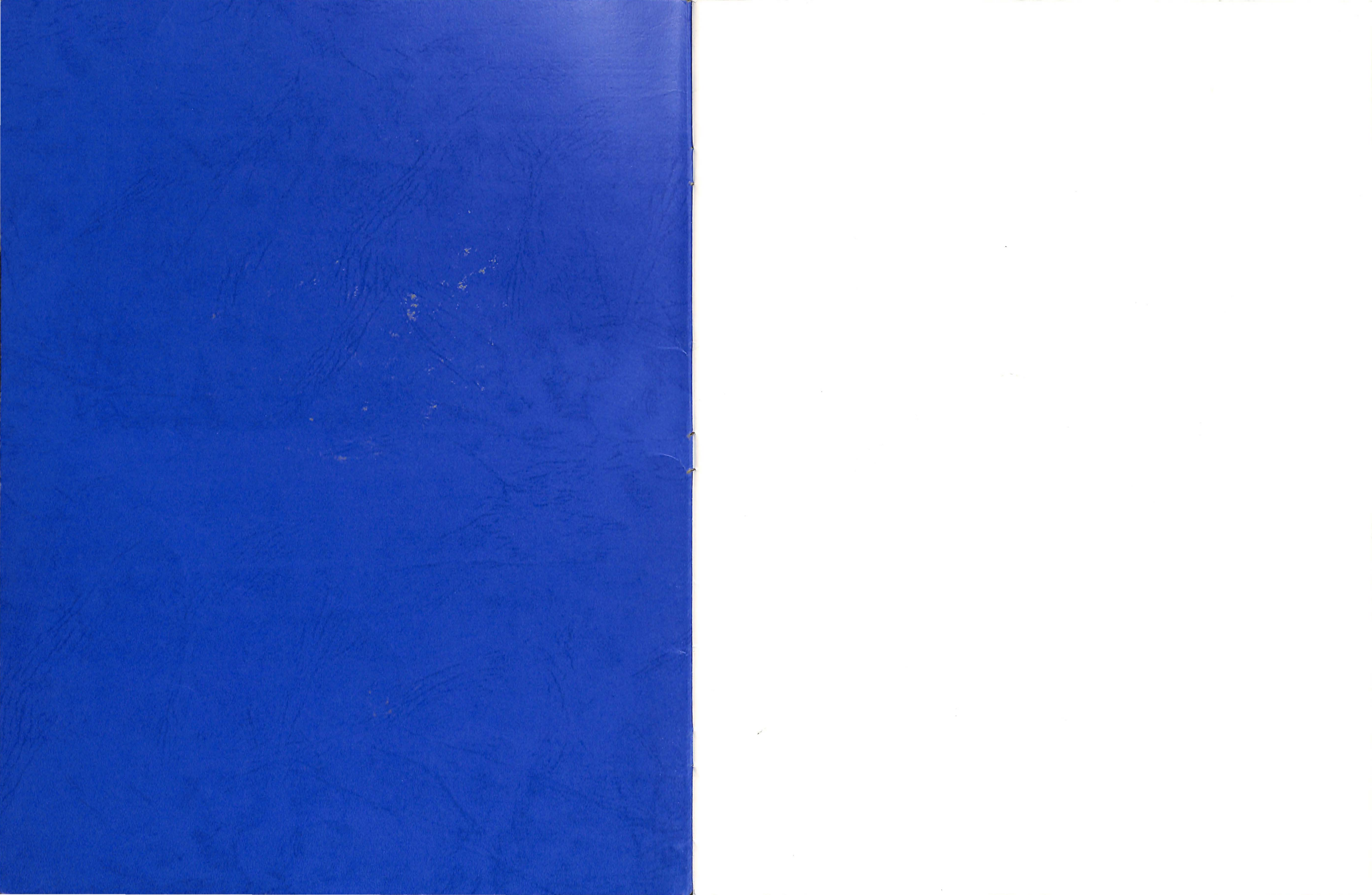
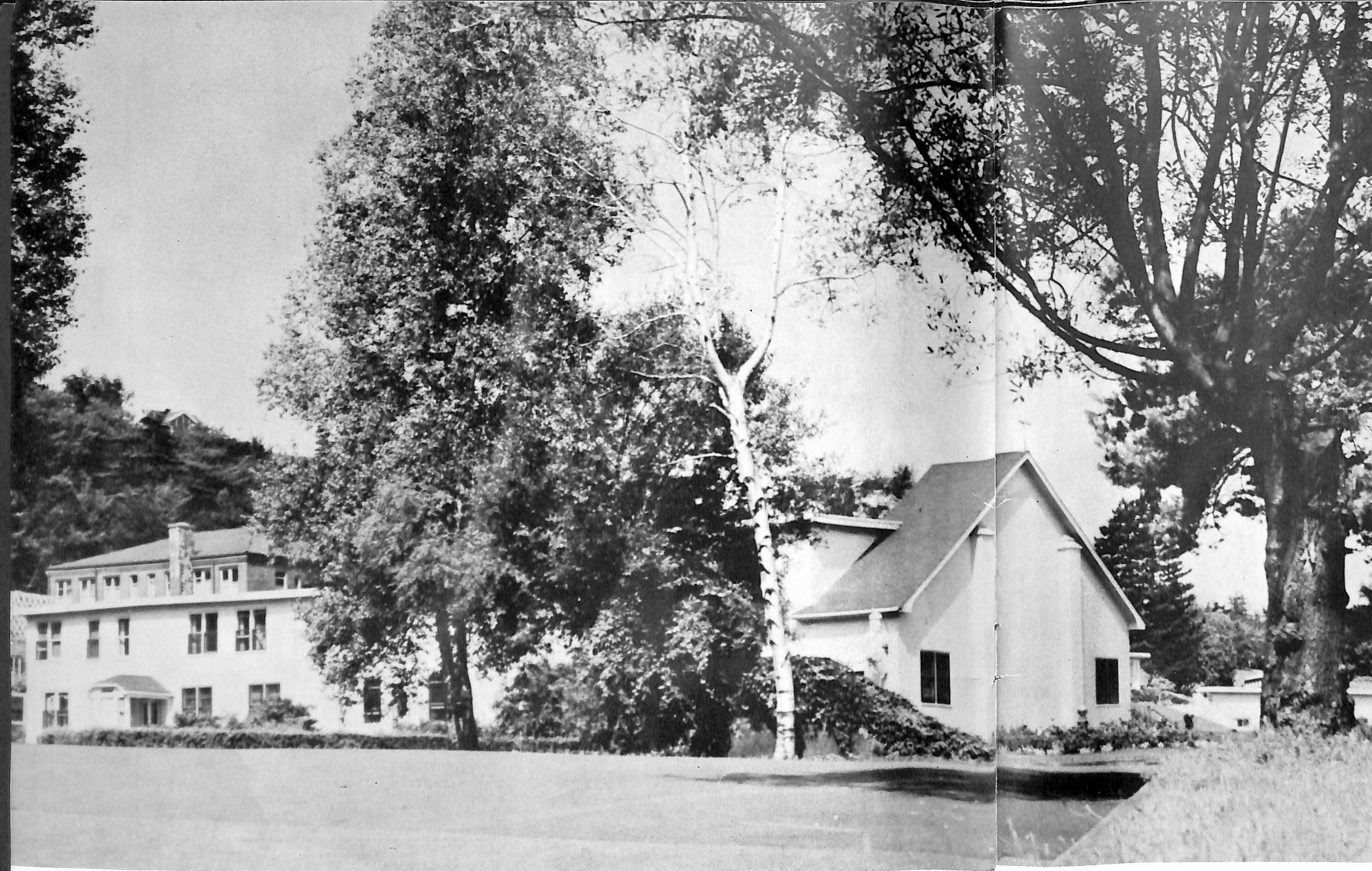

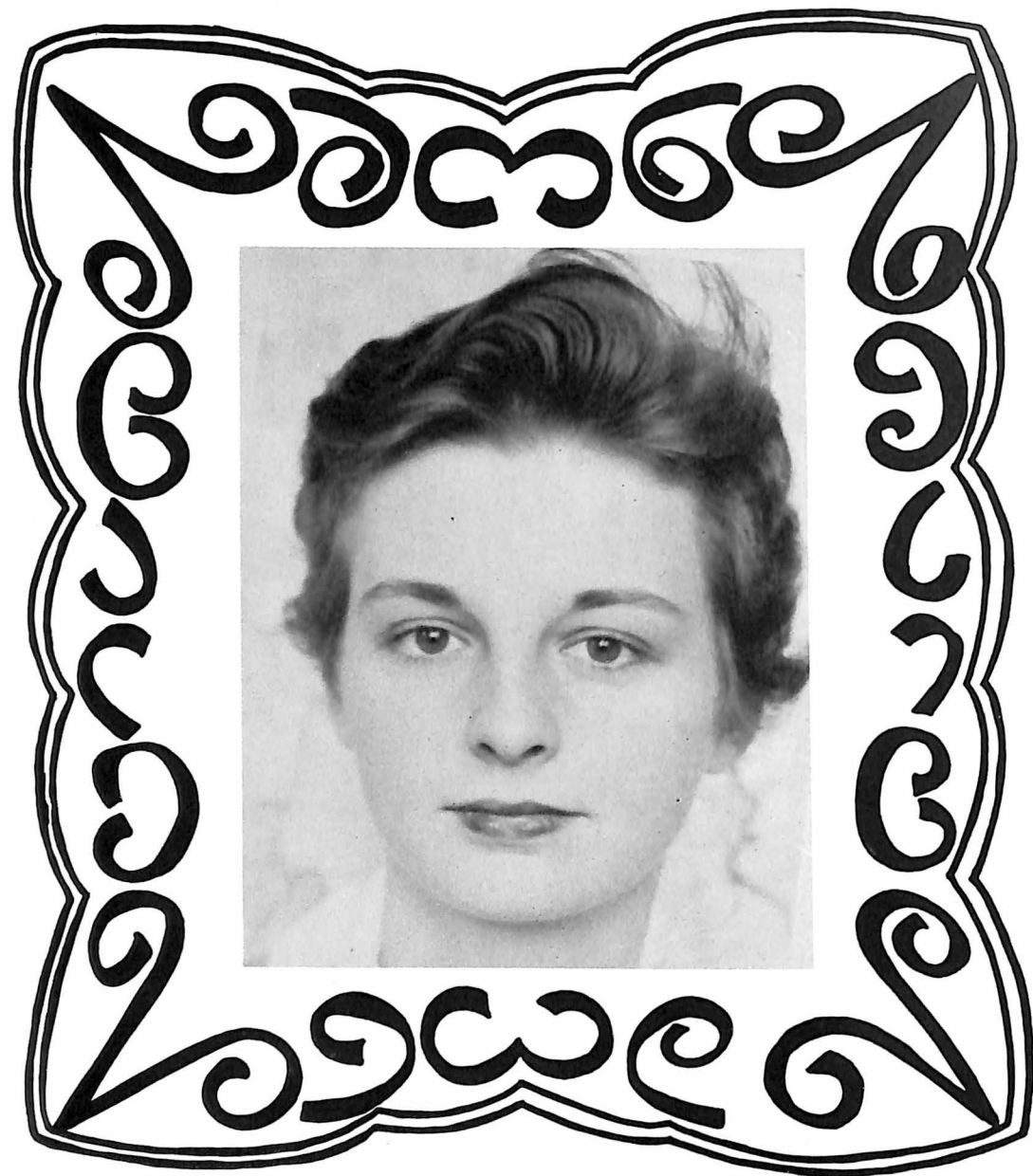

MARGUERITE MILES

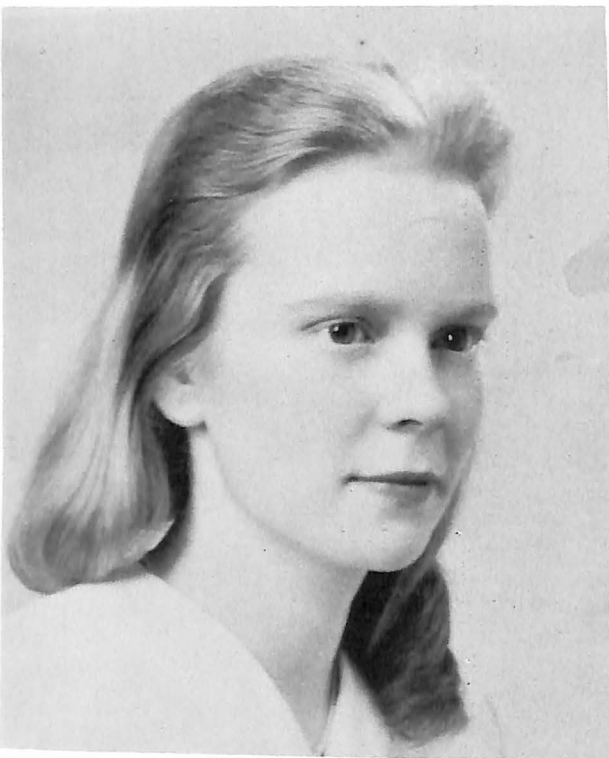

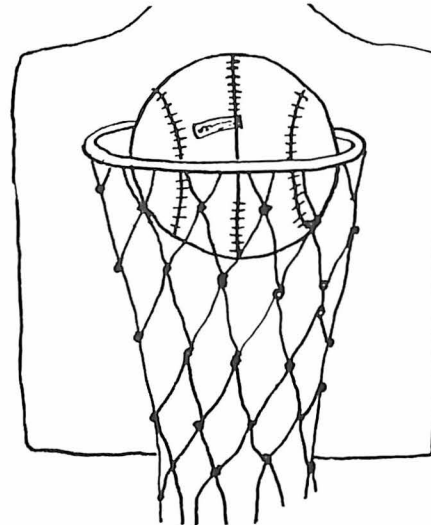
