

with Sex-ed 101, and finally at 10 pm our *Mount That Party* with comedy skits from a few hilarious Halifax comedians.


Shinerama

If you think you may be depressed, please don't be afraid to ask a doctor, or your MSVU psychologist, about your concerns. Depression is common, and can last from days to months to years. It can be treated by counseling and/or medications. Don't decide that because your suffering isn't as intense as someone else's that you must not be depressed. Pain is pain. You are an adult now, and you must decide what's best for your health. Most importantly, don't feel

embarrassed of your feelings or feel that you have to "prove" you're suffering; if you could control these feelings, depression wouldn't be anyone's problem. Visits to your MSVU psychologist are free. Call your MSVU Counselling Services to make an appointment today. Look for a campus-wide depression screening that will be held in the Seton building in October.

dampen the spirits of the participants. When our float passed by, we had lots of people clapping and taking photos of our design, and we recognized many students, faculty, and staff in the crowd.

The most fantastic sight was on Spring Garden Road where so many people had turned out despite the downpour of rain to cheer and celebrate the parade as it passed through. again next year. Our float will be bigger and better.
